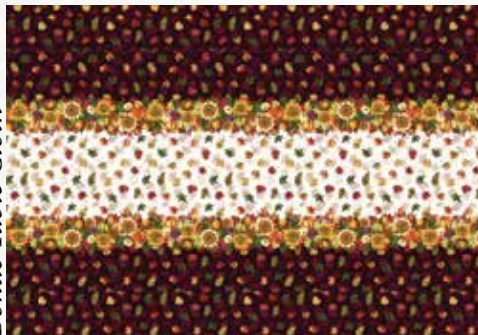

## Table Set

### Runner Materials

1 yard	Border Stripe - Cream (A)	2666-33
¼ yard	Swirls - Green (B)	2669-66
¼ yard	Pumpkin Toss - Pumpkin (C)	2663-35
⅓ yard	Swirls - Pumpkin (D)	2669-35
⅓ yard	Daisy Bouquet - Cream (E)	2667-33
⅓ yard	Harvest Marble - Pumpkin (F)	2668-35
⅜ yard	Harvest Plaid - Green (G)	2670-66*
1 ½ yards	Leaf Toss - Burgundy (Backing)	2664-89

\*Includes binding

### Runner Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Border Stripe - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 34 ½" x 10 ½" strip, centered on the sunflowers.

#### From the Swirls - Green (B), cut:

- (1) 1 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.

#### From the Pumpkin Toss - Pumpkin (C), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.

#### From the Swirls - Pumpkin (D), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### From the Daisy Bouquet - Cream (E), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### From the Harvest Marble - Pumpkin (F), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Harvest Plaid - Green (G), cut:

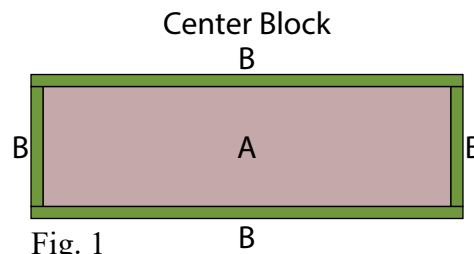
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Leaf Toss - Burgundy (Backing), cut:

- (1) 52" x 28" WOF strip for the backing.

### Runner Assembly

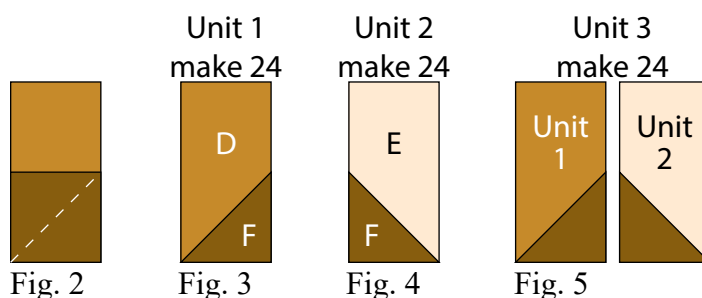
1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 34 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric A strip. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A strip to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).



2. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square on the bottom side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together and aligning the bottoms of the fabrics. (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (24) Unit 2 strips.

4. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to the left side of (1) Unit 2 strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (24) Unit 3 squares total.



5. Sew (9) Unit 3 strips together. Sew (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 6 below). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

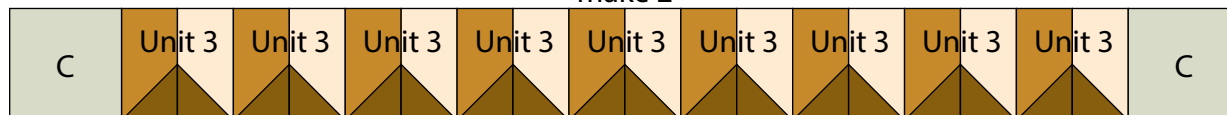

## Table Set

6. Sew (3) Unit 3 squares together to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 7). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

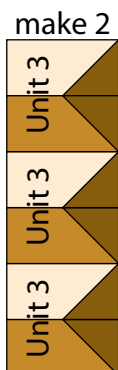

7. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top and Bottom Borders to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the Runner Top (Fig. 8).

8. Layer and quilt as desired.

9. Sew the (4) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric G strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

10. Bind as desired.

1/2 yard	Border Stripe - Cream (A)	2666-33
1/8 yard	Swirls - Green (B)	2669-66
1/8 yard	Daisy Bouquet - Cream (C)	2667-33
1/8 yard	Swirls - Pumpkin (D)	2669-35
1/4 yard	Harvest Marble - Pumpkin (E)	2668-35
5/8 yard	Harvest Plaid - Green (F)	2670-66*
1 3/8 yards	Leaf Toss - Cream (Backing)	2664-33

### Place Mat Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Border Stripe - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (4) 14 1/2" x 12 1/2" rectangles, centered on the sunflowers.

#### From the Swirls - Green (B), cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 1 1/2" x 12 1/2" strips.

#### From the Daisy Bouquet - Cream (C), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.

#### From the Swirls - Pumpkin (D), cut:

- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 2 1/2" x 3 1/2" strips.

#### From the Harvest Marble - Pumpkin (E), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Harvest Plaid - Green (F), cut:

- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Leaf Toss - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 22" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 22" x 16" rectangles.

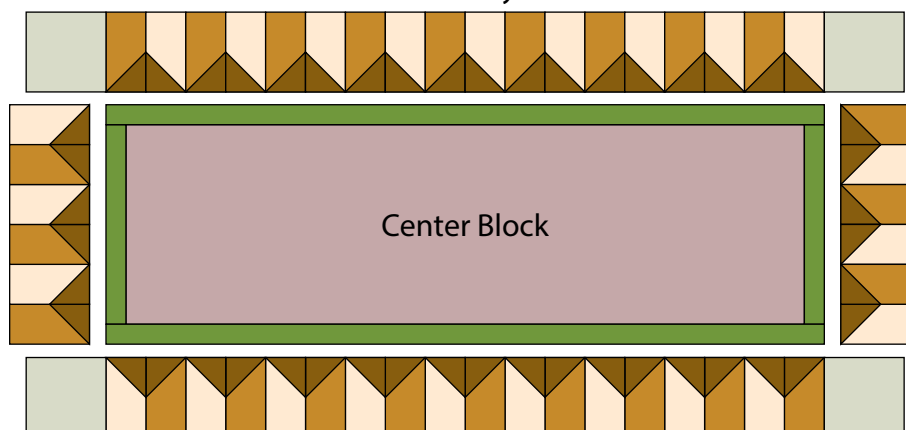

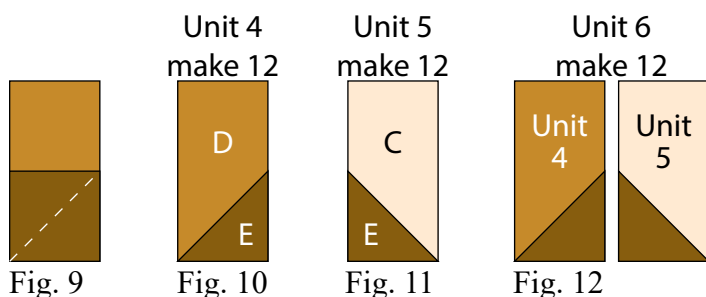

### Place Mat Assembly

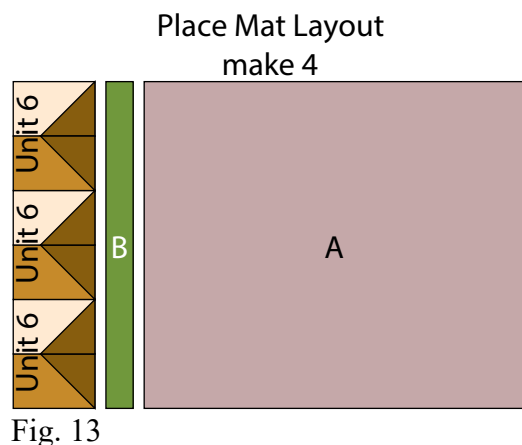
11. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the bottom side of (1) 2 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together and aligning the bottoms of the fabrics. (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (12) Unit 4 strips total.

12. Repeat Step 11 and refer to Figure 11 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (12) Unit 5 strips.

13. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to the left side of (1) Unit 5 strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (12) Unit 6 rectangles total.



14. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric B strip to the left side of (1) 14 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric A strip. Sew (3) Unit 6 rectangles together. Sew the newly sewn strip to the left side of the Fabric B strip to make (1) Place Mat top (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (4) Place Mat Tops total.



15. Layer and quilt as desired.

16. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press. Cut the strip into (4) equal pieces.

17. Bind as desired.

### Table Cloth Materials

2 ½ yards	Border Stripe - Cream (A)	2666-33
2 ½ yards	Leaf Toss - Burgundy (B)	2664-89

### Table Cloth Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Border Stripe - Cream (A), cut:

- (1) 88 ½" x 42" WOF strip.

#### From the Leaf Toss - Burgundy (B), cut:

- (2) 88 ½" x 12" WOF strips.

### Table Cloth Assembly

1. Sew (1) 12" x 88 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 88 ½" x 42" Fabric A strip lengthwise (Fig. 14).

2. Turn under all edges approximately 1". Press and repeat to make a finished edge. Top stitch all edges to complete the Table Cloth.

### Table Cloth Layout

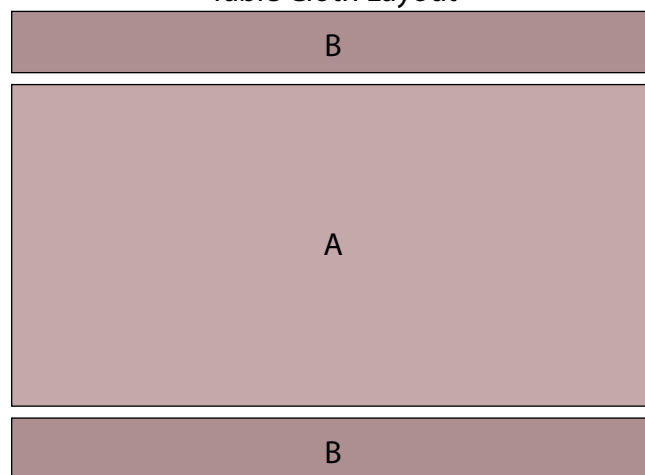
