

Heart Pillow Materials

⅓ yard	Tossed Monotone Dogs - Pink (A)	572-22
1/4 yard	Houndstooth Dogs - Brown (B)	570-33
1/4 yard	Hearts and Bones Toss - Pink (C)	571-22
3/8 yard	Tossed Monotone Dogs - Cream (Backin	g)572-42

You will also need:

• Poly-fill

Heart Pillow Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Tossed Monotone Dogs - Pink (A), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ½" squares.

From the Houndstooth Dogs - Brown (B), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 ½" squares.

From the Hearts and Bones Toss - Pink (C), cut:

- (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 4 ½" squares.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 ½" squares.

From the Tossed Monotone Dogs - Cream (Backing), cut:

• (1) 16 ½" x 12 ½" WOF strip for the back.

Heart Pillow Assembly Instructions

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square on the bottom right corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric A square, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make a second Unit 1 square.

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
2. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figures 3-5 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (2) Unit 2 squares, (2) Unit 3 squares and (2) Unit 4 squares.



3. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric A square on the top left corner of (1) 4 ½" Fabric B square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 7).



- 4. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric C square to the lower right corner of the 4 1/2" Fabric B square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 9).
- 5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make a second Unit 5 square.
- 6. Repeat Steps 3-4 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (2) Unit 6 squares.



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7. Follow Figure 11 and sew the (12) Unit squares together into a 4 x 3 matrix to make (1) Unit 7 rectangle.



8. Using the Heart template provided, cut out (1) Heart Pillow top from the Unit 7 (Fig. 12).



- 9. Using the Heart template provided, cut out (1) Heart Backing piece from the 16 ½" x 12 ½" backing strip.
- 10. Place the Heart Backing piece on top of the Heart Pillow top, right sides together. Sew the two pieces together, leaving a 3" opening for turning.
- 11. Turn the pillow right side out and stuff with poly-fill. Hand sew the opening closed to complete the Heart Pillow.

Square Pillow Materials

⅓ yard	Box of Chocolates - Brown/Pink (A)	575-32
1/4 yard	Tossed Monotone Dogs - Pink (B)	572-22
1/4 yard	Textured Hearts Toss - White/Pink (C)	573-20
1/4 yard	Hearts and Bones Toss - Pink (D)	571-22
½ yard	Tossed Envelopes – Multi (Backing)	576-20

You will also need:

- (2) 2" Button blanks that can be covered with fabric
- Poly-fill

Square Pillow Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Box of Chocolates - Brown/Pink (A), cut:

- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3 ½" squares.
- Fussy cut (2) 4" squares each centered on a chocolate to cover the button blanks.

From the Tossed Monotone Dogs - Pink (B), cut:

• (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (7) 3 ½" squares.

From the Textured Hearts Toss - White/Pink (C), cut:

• (1) 4 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 4 1/4" triangles.

From the Hearts and Bones Toss - Pink (D), cut:

• (1) 4 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (24) 4 1/4" triangles.

From the Tossed Envelopes - Multi (Backing), cut:

• (1) 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 15 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square for the back.

Square Pillow Assembly Instructions

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

12. Follow Figure 13 and sew together (2) 4 1/4" Fabric D triangles and (2) 4 1/4" Fabric C triangles to make (1) 3 ½" Unit 8 square. Repeat to make (12) Unit 8 squares total.



13. Follow Figure 14 and sew together (6) 3 ½" Fabric A squares, (7) 3 ½" Fabric B squares and (12) Unit 8 squares into a 5 x 5 matrix to make (1) Unit 9 square.

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

- 14. Place the 15 ½" x 15 ½" Backing square on top of the Unit 9 square right sides together. Sew the two pieces together, leaving a 3" opening for turning.
- 15. Turn the pillow right side out and stuff with poly-fil. Hand sew the opening closed.
- 16. Follow the manufacturer's instructions to cover the two 2" Button Blanks with the 4" Fabric A squares to make the buttons.
- 17. Measure and mark the center of the pillow. Sew one button to the center of the pillow front with a long needle, going all the way through the pillow to the back side. Add the second button to the needle on the back side. Sew the two buttons to the pillow at the same time to create the center dimple on each side to complete the Square Pillow.





Fig. 15



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
