



Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 24 Inch Panel - Gray (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ¹/₂" x 42 ¹/₂" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Folio Basics - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 ¹/₂" WOF strips, piece as needed
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 60 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 1 ¹/₂" x 41 ¹/₂" WOF strips.
- (7) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Cat Treats - White (C), cut:

- (2) 2 ¹/₂" x 27 ¹/₂" WOF strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 2" x 44 ¹/₂" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 62 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Small Foliage - Midnight Blue (D), cut:

- (2) 6 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (7) 6 ⁷/₈" squares.
- (2) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Swirls - Gray (E), cut:

- (3) 6 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (14) 6 ⁷/₈" squares.
- (3) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 3 ¹/₂" squares and (2) 3 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" strips.

From the Calico - Mulberry (F), cut:

- (2) 6 ⁷/₈" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (7) 6 ⁷/₈" squares and (4) 3 ¹/₂" squares.
- (1) 3 ¹/₂" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 ¹/₂" squares.

From the Border Stripe - Gray (G), cut:

- (2) 5 ¹/₂" x 79" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 5 ¹/₂" x 58 " LOF strips.


From the Cat Medallions - Gray (Backing), cut:

• (2) 62" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 62" x 83" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.


 Sew (1) 2" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 24 ½" x 44 ½".



2. Place (1) 6 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square on top of (1) 6 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric E square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 2). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3) to make (2) halfsquare triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (14) Unit 1 squares total.




3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figure 5 for fabric identification and placement to make (14) Unit 2 squares.



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
4. Place (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 7).




5. Follow Figure 8 for the seam direction to add a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to the lower right corner of the Unit 1 square to make (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Block One square (Fig. 9).

6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (14) Block One squares total.

7. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figure 10 for component identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (14) Block Two squares.




8. Place (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square on the top half of (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, right sides together and aligning the tops of the fabrics (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance (Fig. 12).




9. Place (1) 3 ¹/₂" Fabric F square on the bottom half of the 3 ¹/₂" x 6 ¹/₂" Fabric E strip, right sides together and aligning the bottoms of the fabrics (Fig. 13). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 13). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance to make (1) Block Three rectangle (Fig. 14).

10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make a second Block Three rectangle.



11. Sew together, (4) Block One squares and (4) Block Two squares alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Left Side Border (Fig. 15).

12. Sew together (4) Block Two squares and (4) Block One squares, alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Right Side Border (Fig. 16).



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13. Sew together (3) Block Two squares and (3) Block One squares alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) Block Three rectangle to the right end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 17).



14. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (3) Block Two squares alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) Block Three rectangle to the left end of the newly sewn strip to make the Bottom Border (Fig. 18).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 15. Sew (1) 2" x 44 ¹/₂" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block.

16. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ x 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew the Left Side Border and Right Side Border to the left and to the right sides of the Center Block.

18. Sew the Top Border and the Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


19. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 60 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $1 \frac{1}{2}$ " x 41 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

20. Sew (1) 2" x 62 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 44 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

21. Center (1) $5\frac{1}{2}$ " x 79" Fabric G strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the top edge of the block and stop a $\frac{1}{4}$ " from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

22. Repeat Step 21 to sew (1) 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 58" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 19).

23. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 19), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.




24. Layer and quilt as desired.

25. Sew the (7) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

26. Bind as desired.
