



Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 36 Inch Embroidered Stocking Panel - Red (A):

• Fussy cut (9) 6 ½" x 8" rectangles, each centered on a block.

From the Dots - Red (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 2" x 8" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 2" x 9 ½" strip.
- (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Stars - Cream (C), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 2 ½" x 3" strips.
- (3) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 1 ³/₄" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 1 ½" x 10" strips.

From the Stars - Red (D), cut:

- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 3" squares.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3" x 5 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Stockings - Cream (E), cut:

- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3" x 5 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Christmas Lights - Red (F), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" x 3" strips.
- (2) 1 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ³/₄" x 10 ¹/₂" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 10" strips.

From the Check - Red/Cream (G), cut:

- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 8" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 9 ½" strip.

From the Stripe - Red/Cream (H), cut:

- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 51 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 44 ½" strips.

From the Redwork Motifs in Circles - Red (I), cut:

- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 53 ½" strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 54 ½" strips.


From the Redwork Motifs in Circles - Cream (Backing), cut:

• (2) 62" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 62" x 71" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 8" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" x 8" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 9 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure** 8 ½" x 10". Repeat to make (5) Unit 1 rectangles total.




2. Sew (1) 2" x 8" Fabric G strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" x 8" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 9 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure** 8 ½" x 10". Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 rectangles total.



3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 rectangle. Sew (1) 1 ¾" x 10 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 rectangle to make (1) 10 ½" x 12 ½" Unit 3 rectangle (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (5) Unit 3 rectangles total.



4. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 rectangle. Sew (1) 1 ¾" x 10 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 rectangle to make (1) 10 ½" x 12 ½" Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 rectangles total.




5. Place (1) 3" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 3" x 5 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 6).






- 6. Place another 3" Fabric D square on the right side of the 3" x 5 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 7). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 7). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 8).
- 7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (10) Unit 5 strips total.







8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figures 9-11 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (10) Unit 6 strips, (8) Unit 7 strips and (8) Unit 8 strips.




9. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 6 strip to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (10) Unit 9 strips total.



10. Sew (1) Unit 7 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 8 strip to make (1) Unit 10 strip (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (8) Unit 10 strips.




11. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square on the top half of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together and aligning the tops of the fabrics (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ½" seam allowance (Fig. 15).



- 12. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric D square on the bottom half of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together and aligning the bottoms of the fabrics (Fig. 16). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 16). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 11 strip (Fig. 17).
- 13. Repeat Steps 11-12 to make (10) Unit 11 strips.



14. Repeat Steps 11-12 and refer to Figures 18-20 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (10) Unit 12 strips, (8) Unit 13 strips and (8) Unit 14 strips.



15. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 21). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 21). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance (Fig. 22).







16. Place another 2 ½" Fabric D square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 23). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 23). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 15 strip (Fig. 24).

- 17. Repeat Steps 15-16 to make (10) Unit 15 strips total.
- 18. Repeat Steps 15-16 and refer to Figure 25 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (8) Unit 16 strips.




- 19. Sew together (1) Unit 11 strip, (1) Unit 15 strip and (1) Unit 12 strip, end to end and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Unit 17 strip (Fig. 26). Repeat to make (10) Unit 17 strips total.
- 20. Sew together (1) Unit 13 strip, (1) Unit 16 strip and (1) Unit 14 strip, end to end and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Unit 18 strip (Fig. 27). Repeat to make (8) Unit 18 strips total.




21. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 3" Fabric F strip to each end of (1) Unit 9 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 17 strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 rectangle to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 14 ½" x 17 ½" Block One rectangle (Fig. 28). Repeat to make (5) Block One rectangles total.



22. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 3" Fabric C strip to each end of (1) Unit 10 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 18 strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 rectangle to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 14 ½" x 17 ½" Block Two rectangle (Fig. 29). Repeat to make (4) Block Two rectangles total.



- 23. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to each side of (1) Block Two rectangle lengthwise to make Row One (Fig. 30). Repeat to make Row Three.
- 24. Sew (1) Block Two rectangle to each side of (1) Block One rectangle lengthwise to make Row Two (Fig. 30).
- 25. Sew together the (3) Rows from Steps 23-24 to make the $42 \frac{1}{2}$ " x $51 \frac{1}{2}$ " Center Block (Fig. 30).




Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
26. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric H strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 27. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 53 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 54 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 28. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 29. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 30. Bind as desired.
