





Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Zodiac Figures Block Print - Navy (A):

• Fussy cut (12) 9 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Constellation Map - Navy (B), cut:

- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Constellation Map - Cream (C), cut:

- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

From the Allover Symbols - Cream (D), cut:

• (6) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (47) 5 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (188) 5 ½" triangles. *Note: You will only use (186) 5 ½" triangles.*

From the Tossed Zodiac Constellations - Navy (E), cut:

• (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 5 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (124) 5 ½" triangles.

From the Tossed Astronomy Devices - Medium Blue (F), cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 5 ½" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (64) 5 ½" triangles. *Note: You will only use (62) 5 ½" triangles.*
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 68 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 ½" strips.

From the Celestial Motifs - Navy (G), cut:

• (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4 ½" squares.

From the Zodiac Stripe - Navy (H), cut:

- (2) 7 ½" x 89" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 7 ½" x 73" LOF strips.


From the Star Tiles - Royal (Backing), cut:

• (2) 93" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 77" x 93" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 9 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 10** ½" x 10 ½". Repeat to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Block One squares total.


- 3. Sew (1) 5 ¼" Fabric D triangle and (1) 5 ¼" Fabric E triangle together to make (1) DE triangle. Sew (1) 5 ¼" Fabric E triangle and (1) 5 ¼" Fabric D triangle together to make (1) ED triangle. Sew the DE and ED triangles together along their long sides to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). The unit should measure 4 ½" square. Repeat to make (62) Unit 2 squares total.
- 4. Repeat Step 3 and refer to Figure 4 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (31) 4 ½" Unit 3 squares.



5. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 3 square, along the Fabric D sides, to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (31) Unit 4 strips total.



- 6. Sew together (4) 4 ½" Fabric G squares and (3) Unit 4 strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 6 below). Repeat to make (5) Unit 5 strips total.
- 7. Sew together (4) Unit 4 strips and (3) Block One squares, alternating them from left to right, to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 7 below). Repeat to make (4) Unit 6 strips total.


8. Sew together the (5) Unit 5 strips and (4) Unit 6 strips. lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make the Center Block (Fig. 8). The block should measure 52 ½" x 68 ½".



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
9. Sew (1) 2" x 68 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 55 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

10. Center (1) 7 ½" x 89" Fabric H strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.




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11. Repeat Step 10 to sew (1) 7 ½" x 73" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 9).

12. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 9), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ½" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



- 13. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 14. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 15. Bind as desired.
