¾ yard	Folio - Red Hot (B)	7755-81
1 ¼ yards	Watercolor Stripe - Multi (C)	9029-87*
½ yard	Modern Melody Basics - True Blue (D)	1063-71
⅔ yard	Block Repeat - Red/White/Blue (E)	9027-78
⅞ yard	Folio - White on White (F)	7755-01
¼ yard	Ice Cream Cones - Red (G)	9034-88
¼ yard	Folio - Royal (H)	7755-77
¼ yard	Lanterns - Red/White/Blue (I)	9032-77
2 ⅓ yards	Novelty Stripe - Red/White/Blue (J)	9036-11
4 ½ yards	Summer Motifs in Patchwork - Red/White/Blue (Backing)	9030-78

Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Eye Glasses - Navy (A), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

From the Folio - Red Hot (B), cut:

- (5) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (56) 3 ½" squares.

From the Watercolor Stripe - Multi (C), cut:

- (2) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (4) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Modern Melody Basics - True Blue (D), cut:

- (2) 3 ⅞" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 3 ⅞" squares.

From the Block Repeat - Red/White/Blue (E):

- Fussy cut (6) 10 ¾" x 10 ⅞" rectangles each centered on a block.

From the Folio - White on White (F), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 10 ⅞" strips.
- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2" x 13 ¾" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 39 ½" WOF strips.

From the Ice Cream Cones - Red (G), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

From the Folio - Royal (H), cut:

- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3 ½" squares.

From the Lanterns - Red/White/Blue (I), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 6 ½" squares.

From the Novelty Stripe - Red/White/Blue (J); cut:

- (4) 10 ¼" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 10 ¼" x 75" strips.
- (4) 10 ¼" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 10 ¼" x 63" strips.

From the Summer Motifs in Patchwork - Red/White/Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 79" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 67" x 79" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 10 ⅞" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) 10 ¾" x 10 ⅞" Fabric E rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 13 ¾" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric E block. Trim the block to measure 12 ½" square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 squares total



2. Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric B square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 3).





3. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 3 ½" Fabric B square to each of the remaining corners of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 5).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (6) Block One squares total.





5. Place (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the left side of (1) $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 7).





6. Place another $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the right side of the $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Flip open the triangle formed and press to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 9).







7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (16) Unit 2 strips total.

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (8) Unit 3 strips.

9. Place (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C square on top of (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 11). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 11). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 12) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 4 squares (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (12) Unit 4 squares total.







10. Place (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric C square on top of (1) $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 14). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 14). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 15) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 5 squares (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (12) Unit 5 squares total.





11. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the left side of (1) Unit 2 strip. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the right side of the Unit 2 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.



12. Repeat Step 11 and refer to Figures 18-19 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (2) Block Three squares and (2) Block Four squares.





Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

13. Sew (1) Block Two square, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Three square together in that order to make Row One.

14. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Four square to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

15. Sew (1) Block Three square, (1) Block One square and (1) Block Two square together in that order to make Row Three.

16. Sew the (4) rows together to make the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) 2" x 48 1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 39 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

18. Center (1) 10 1/4" x 75" Fabric J strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

19. Repeat Step 18 to sew (1) 10 1/4" x 63" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 20).

20. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 20), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.




21. Layer and quilt as desired.

22. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

23. Bind as desired.
