3/4 yard	Leaves and Berries - Slate Blue Green (B)	2961-67
3/8 yard	Leaves and Berries - Pink (C)	2961-22
3/4 yard	Buttermilk Blenders - Cream (D)	2944-36
3/4 yard	Nosegay Toss - Green (E)	2963-60
1 yard	Swirl Floral Texture - Brown (F)	2966-38*
1/3 yard	Buttermilk Blenders - Brown (G)	2944-38
1/2 yard	Swirl Floral Texture - Cream (H)	2966-33
1/3 yard	Tossed Cubes - Slate Blue Green (I)	2964-67
1/2 yard	Nosegay Toss - Red (J)	2963-88
1/2 yard	Tossed Cubes - Pink (K)	2964-22
1/3 yard	Buttermilk Blenders - Brick (L)	2944-80
1 7/8 yards	Border Stripe - Cream (M)	2967-33

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Panel 36 x 44 - Cream (A):

- Fussy cut (1) 40 1/2" x 32 1/2" rectangle, centered on the panel.

From the Leaves and Berries - Slate Blue Green (B), cut:

- (2) 3" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 3" x 45 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (38) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Leaves and Berries - Pink (C), cut:

- (2) 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (48) 5 1/4" triangles.

From the Buttermilk Blenders - Cream (D), cut:

- (2) 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (11) 5 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (44) 5 1/4" triangles.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 54 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips.

From the Nosegay Toss - Green (E), cut:

- (1) 5 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (1) 5 1/4" square and (6) 2 1/2" squares. Cut the 5 1/4" square across both diagonals to make (4) 5 1/4" triangles.
- (3) 4 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 4 7/8" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (40) 4 7/8" triangles.
- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Swirl Floral Texture - Brown (F), cut:

- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 60 1/2" strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 68 1/2" strips.
- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Buttermilk Blenders - Brown (G), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (38) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Swirl Floral Texture - Cream (H), cut:

- (4) 3 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (38) 3 1/4" squares. Cut the squares across both diagonals to make (152) 3 1/4" triangles.

From the Tossed Cubes - Slate Blue Green (I), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (38) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Nosegay Toss - Red (J), cut:

- (3) 4 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (19) 4 7/8" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (38) 4 7/8" triangles.

From the Tossed Cubes - Pink (K), cut:

- (3) 4 7/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (19) 4 7/8" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (38) 4 7/8" triangles.

From the Buttermilk Blenders - Brick (L), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (38) 2 1/2" squares.

From the Border Stripe - Cream (M), cut:

- (2) 6 1/2" x 62 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 6 1/2" x 68 1/2" LOF strips.

From the Nosegay Toss - Cream (N), cut:

- (1) 6 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 1/2" squares.

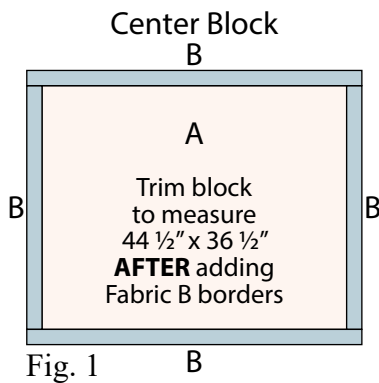
From the Square Wreath - Cream (Backing), cut:

- (2) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 82" x 88" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 3" x 32 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 40 1/2" x 32 1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 3" x 45 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 44 1/2" x 36 1/2"**.



2. Sew (1) 5 1/4" Fabric D triangle and (1) 5 1/4" Fabric C triangle together along short sides. Sew (1) 4 7/8" Fabric E triangle to the long side of the newly sewn triangle to make (1) 4 1/2" Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (20) Unit 1 squares total.



3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figure 3 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (20) Unit 2 squares.



4. Follow Figure 4 and sew together (2) 5 1/4" Fabric C triangles, (1) 5 1/4" Fabric D triangle and (1) 5 1/4" Fabric E triangle to make (1) 4 1/2" Unit 3 square. Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 squares total.



5. Follow Figure 5 and sew together (4) Unit 1 squares, (4) Unit 2 squares and (1) Unit 3 square to make the Inner Left Side Border.

5. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 6-8 for component identification, placement and orientation to make the Inner Right Side Border, the Inner Top Border and the Inner Bottom Border.

7. Sew (1) 3 1/4" Fabric H triangle to the left side of (1) 2 1/2" Fabric B square to make the top row. Sew (1) 3 1/4" Fabric H triangle to each side of (1) 2 1/2" Fabric G square to make the middle row. Sew (1) 3 1/4" Fabric H triangle to the right side of (1) 2 1/2" Fabric E square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (3) rows to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (38) Unit 4 strips total.

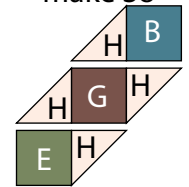

8. Sew (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric J triangle to the top of the Unit 4 strip along the long side. Sew (1) $4\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric K triangle to the bottom of the Unit 4 strip along the long side to make (1) $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 5 square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (38) Unit 5 squares total.

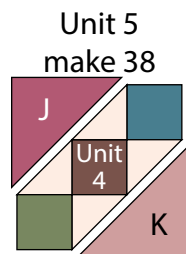

9. Place (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric I square on the top left corner of (1) Unit 5 square, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 12).

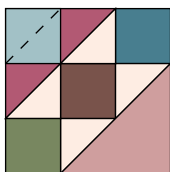

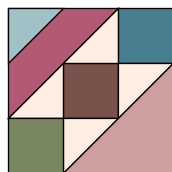

10. Follow Figure 13 for the seam direction to add a $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric L square to the lower right corner of the Unit 5 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 14).

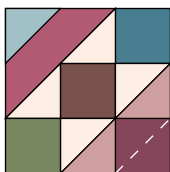

11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (38) Block One squares total.

12. Sew together (8) Block One squares to make (1) Outer Side Border (Fig. 15). Repeat to make a second Outer Side Border.

13. Sew together (11) Block One squares to make (1) Outer Top Border (Fig. 16).

14. Sew together (11) Block One squares to make (1) Outer Bottom Border (Fig. 17).

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

15. Sew the Inner Left Side Border and Inner Right Side Border to the left and right sides of the Center Block.

16. Sew the Inner Top Border and the Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

17. Sew (1) $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x $44\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block.

18. Sew (1) $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x $54\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) Outer Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

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20. Sew the Outer Top Border and the Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

21. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 60 1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 68 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

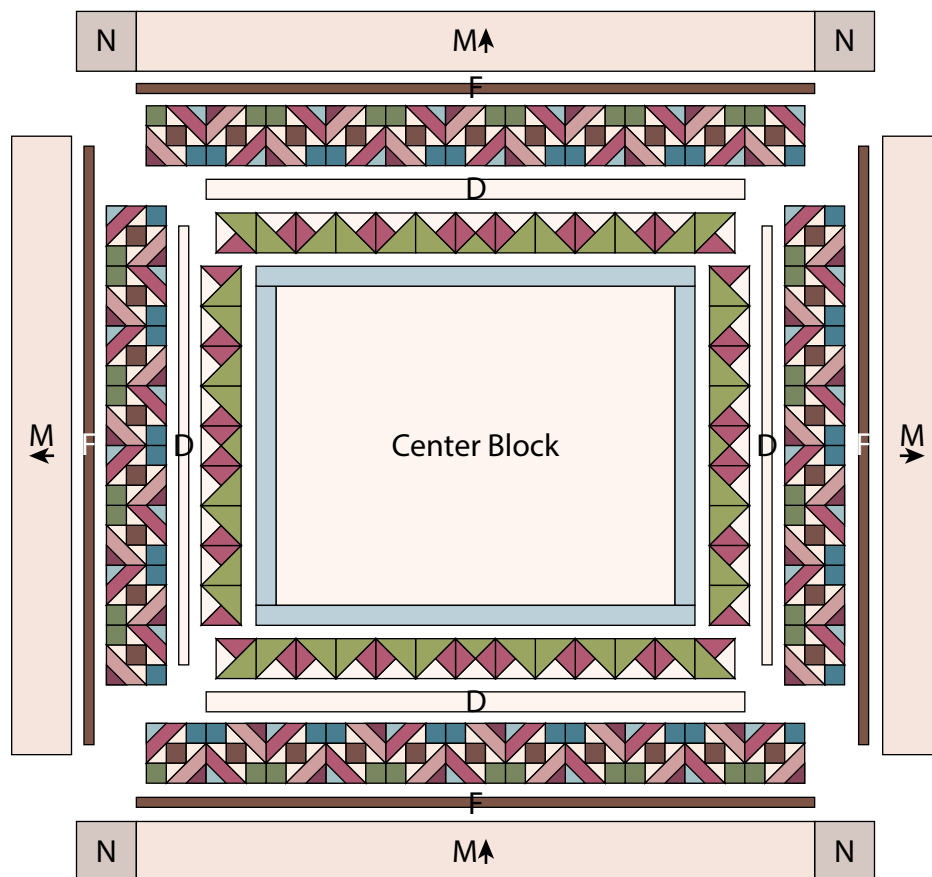
22. Sew (1) 6 1/2" x 62 1/2" Fabric M strip to each side of the Center Block.

23. Sew (1) 6 1/2" Fabric N square to each end of (1) 6 1/2" x 68 1/2" Fabric M strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

24. Layer and quilt as desired.

25. Sew the (8) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

26. Bind as desired.
