From the Words - Royal (I), cut:
-(4) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $31 / 2 " \times 721 / 2 "$ strips.

- (3) $31 / 2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $31 / 2 " \times 601 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Crimson Red (J), cut:
-(4) $2 " x$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $2 " \times 781 / 2 "$ strips.

- (4) $2 " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $2 " \times 631 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Tossed Fireboat - Cyan (K), cut:
-(4) $6 \frac{1}{2} " \times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $6 \frac{1}{2} \prime$ " $\times 811 / 2 "$ strips.
-(4) $61 / 2 " x$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) $6 \frac{1}{2}$ " $\times 631 / 2 "$ strips.

From the Tossed Fireboat - Cyan (Backing), cut:

- (2) 101" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the $83 " \times 101 "$ back.


## Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) $67 / 8 "$ Fabric E square on top of (1) $67 / 8 "$ Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew $1 / 4$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) halfsquare triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 6 $1 / 2 "$ to make (2) Unit 1 squares
(Fig. 3). Repeat to make (48) Unit 1 squares total.

2. Place (1) $31 / 2 "$ Fabric D square on the bottom left corner of (1) Unit 1 square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4$ " away from the sewn seam (Fig. 5).

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3. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a $31 / 2$ " Fabric D square to the upper right corner of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 7).
4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (48) Unit 2 squares total.

5. Place (1) Fabric D Template 1 triangle on top of (1) Fabric C Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the left sides (Fig. 8). Sew the (2) triangles together along the left side. Press the smaller triangle open.

6. Place (1) Fabric D Template 3 triangle on top of the Fabric C Template 2 triangle, right sides together, aligning the right sides (Fig. 9). Sew the (2) triangles together along the right side. Press the smaller triangle open to make (1) Unit 3 (Fig. 10). Trim the block to measure $61 / 2 "$ square.
7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (24) Unit 3 squares total.

8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 11 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (24) Unit 4 squares.

9. Place (1) $31 / 2 "$ Fabric B square on the bottom left corner of (1) Unit 3 square, right sides together (Fig. 12). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 12). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle $1 / 4 "$ away from the sewn seam (Fig. 13).

10. Follow Figure 14 for the seam direction to add a $31 / 2$ " Fabric D square to the lower right corner of the Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 5 square (Fig. 15).
11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (24) Unit 5 squares total.
12. Repeat Steps 9-10 and refer to Figure 16 for component identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (24) Unit 6 squares.

13. Sew (1) unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 5 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to each side of (1) $61 / 2 "$ Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) $181 / 2$ " Block One square (Fig. 17). Repeat to make
(6) Block One squares total.

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14. Repeat Step 13 and refer to Figure 18 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Block Two squares.

15. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 19). Repeat to make Row Three.
16. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 19). Repeat to make Row Four.
17. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps $15-16$, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the $541 / 2 " \times 721 / 2 "$ Center Block (Fig. 19).

## Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
18. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 721 / 2 "$ Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $31 / 2 " \times 601 / 2 "$ Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
19. Sew (1) 2 " $\times 781 / 2 "$ Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x $631 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
20. Sew (1) $61 / 2 " \times 811 / 2 "$ Fabric K strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) $61 / 2$ " Fabric H square to each end of (1) $61 / 2 " \times 631 / 2 "$ Fabric K strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
21. Layer and quilt as desired.
22. Sew the (9) $21 / 2 " \times$ WOF Fabric $H$ strips together, end to end with 45 -degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
23. Bind as desired.
