$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Tossed Carrots - Orange (D)	9926-43
$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Tossed Watercolor Flowers - Cream (E)	9927-07
$\frac{2}{3}$ yard	Modern Melody Basics - Silver Gray (F)	1063-90*
$\frac{3}{8}$ yard	Tossed Bunnies - Multi (G)	9925-73
$\frac{1}{4}$ yard	Folio Basic - Cerulean Blue (H)	7755-71
$\frac{3}{8}$ yard	Tossed Accessories - Multi (I)	9924-97
$\frac{1}{3}$ yard	Modern Melody Basics - Orange (J)	1063-34

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the 10 Honeycomb Blocks 18in x 44in - Multi (A):

- Fussy cut (15) 8" squares, each centered on a block.

From the Plaid - Multi (B), cut:

- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2" x 8" strips.
- (10) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (30) 2" x 11" strips.

From the Packed Bunnies - Multi (C), cut:

- (1) 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips and (2) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.

From the Tossed Carrots - Orange (D), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Tossed Watercolor Flowers - Cream (E), cut:

- (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (12) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Silver Gray (F), cut:

- (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 27 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (2) 1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 29 $\frac{1}{2}$ " WOF strips.
- (6) 2 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Tossed Bunnies - Multi (G), cut:

- (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 5" strips and (4) 4" x 5" strips.

From the Folio Basic - Cerulean Blue (H), cut:

- (2) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) 1" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 1" x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) 1" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 1" x 4" strips.

From the Tossed Accessories - Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (1) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 4" strips.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Orange (J), cut:

- (3) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 47 $\frac{1}{2}$ " strips.
- (3) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 $\frac{1}{4}$ " x 49" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Multi (K), cut:

- (4) 5" x 62" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.

From the Patchwork - Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 66" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 66" x 66" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 8" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 11" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ ".** Repeat to make (15) Block One squares total.

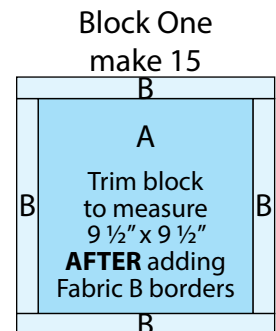

2. Sew (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to each side of (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to make the top row. Sew (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E square to each side of (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to make the bottom row. Sew the top row to the top of (1) 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ " x 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip lengthwise and the bottom row to the bottom of the Fabric C strip to make (1) 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Unit 1 square (Fig. 2).

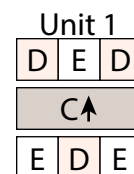

3. Repeat Step 2 and refer to Figures 3-5 for fabric identification, placement and orientation to make (1) Unit 2 square, (1) Unit 3 square and (1) Unit 4 square.

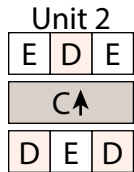

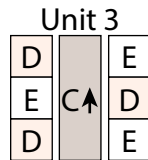

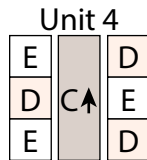

4. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of the Unit 1 square to make the top row (Fig. 6).

5. Sew together the Unit 3 square, (1) Block One square and the Unit 4 square, in that order from left to right, to make the middle row (Fig. 6).

6. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of the Unit 2 square to make the bottom row (Fig. 6).

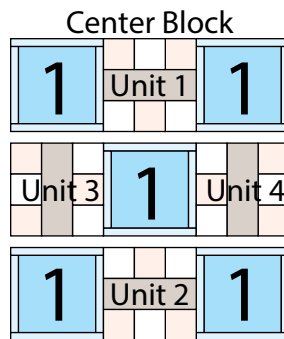

7. Sew together the (3) rows from Steps 4-6 lengthwise to make the 27 1/2" x 27 1/2" Center Block (Fig. 6).

8. Sew together (1) 2 1/4" x 4" Fabric I strip (1) 1" x 4" Fabric H strip, (1) 4" x 5" Fabric G strip, (1) 1" x 4" Fabric H strip and (1) 2 1/4" x 4" Fabric I strip, in that order from left to right, to make (1) 9 1/2" x 4" Unit 5 strip (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 strips total.

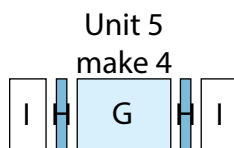

9. Sew together (1) 2 1/4" x 4 1/2" Fabric I strip (1) 1" x 4 1/2" Fabric H strip, (1) 4 1/2" x 5" Fabric G strip, (1) 1" x 4 1/2" Fabric H strip and (1) 2 1/4" x 4 1/2" Fabric I strip, in that order from left to right, to make (1) 9 1/2" x 4 1/2" Unit 6 strip (Fig. 8). Repeat to make a second Unit 6 strip.

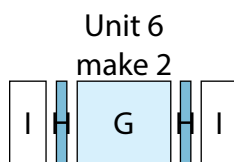

10. Sew together (1) 2 1/4" x 10 1/2" Fabric I strip, (1) 1" x 10 1/2" Fabric H strip, (1) 5" x 10 1/2" Fabric G strip, (1) 1" x 10 1/2" Fabric H strip and (1) 2 1/4" x 10 1/2" Fabric I strip, lengthwise and in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) 10 1/2" x 9 1/2" Unit 7 rectangle (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Unit 7 rectangles total.

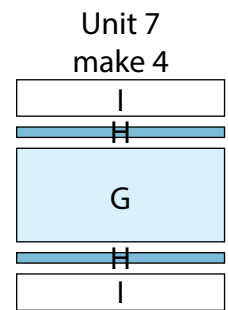

11. Sew together (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 6 strip, (1) Block One square and (1) Unit 5 strip, in that order from top to bottom, to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Side Border.

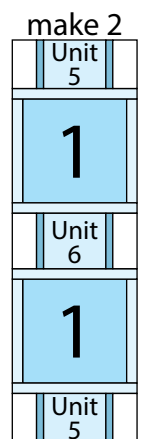

12. Sew together (3) Block One squares and (2) Unit 7 rectangles, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make the Top Border (Fig. 11). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

Top/Bottom Border

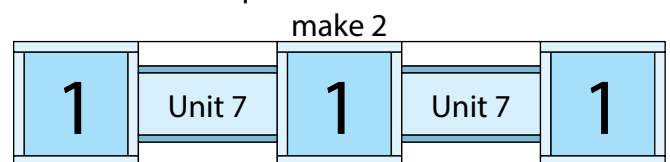

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

13. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 27 1/2" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 29 1/2" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 47 1/2" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 1/4" x 49" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Center (1) 5" x 62" Fabric K strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

17. Repeat Step 16 to sew (1) 5" x 62" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 12).

18. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 12), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

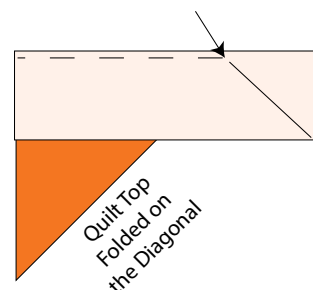
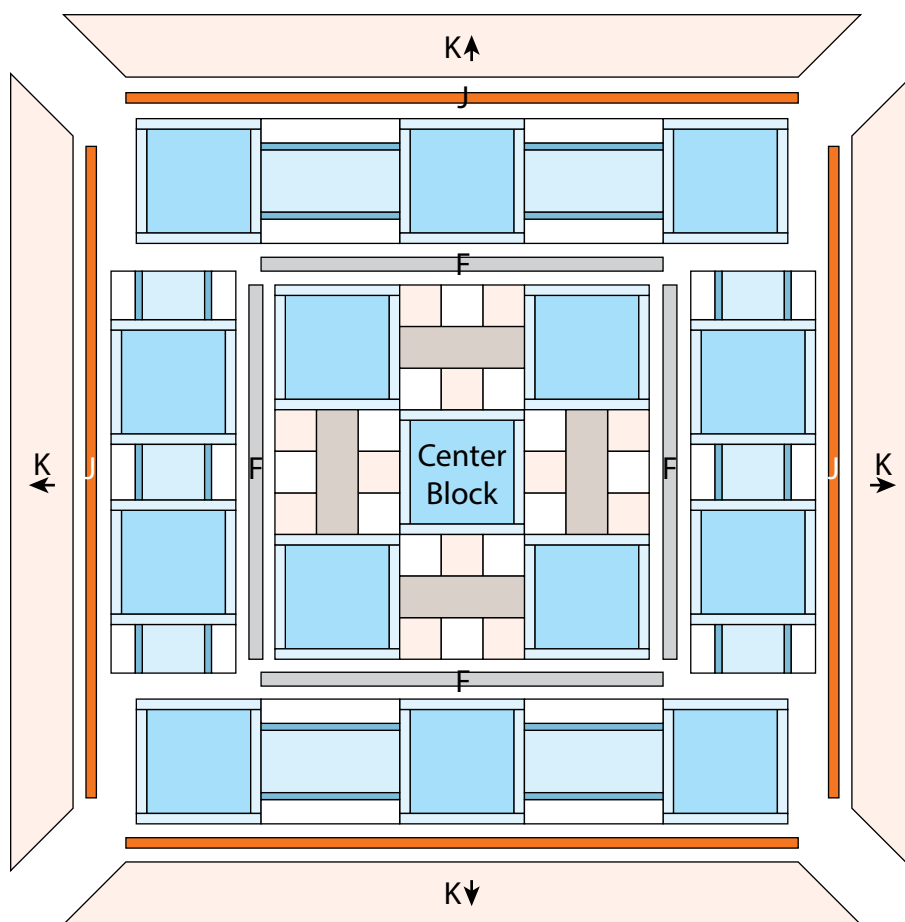

19. Layer and quilt as desired.

20. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric F strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

21. Bind as desired.
