

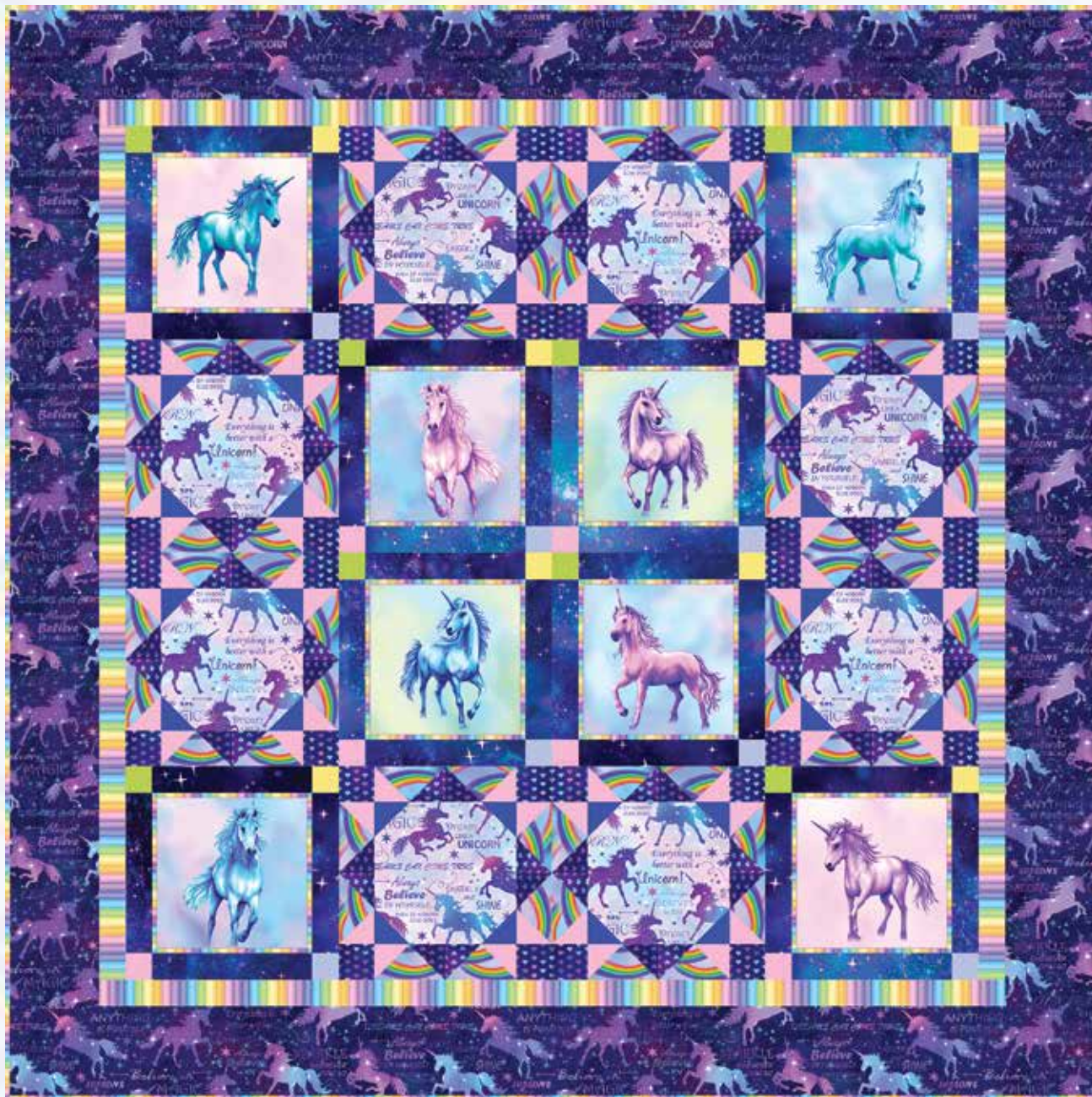

1 yard	Rainbow Stripe - Rainbow Multi (B)	2729-11*
5/8 yard	Starry Night Texture - Royal (C)	2726-77
1/8 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Lime (D)	1063-64
1/8 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Lemon (E)	1063-44
1/2 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Pink (F)	1063-22
1/8 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Light Blue (G)	1063-11
5/8 yard	Unicorn Silhouette - Pink Multi (H)	2725-27
1/4 yard	Modern Melody Basics - Royal (I)	1063-75
2/3 yard	Rainbow Toss - Blue Multi (J)	2730-17
1/2 yard	Rainbow Hearts - Royal Multi (K)	2727-77
1 1/2 yards	Unicorn Silhouette - Royal Multi (L)	2725-77
4 yards	Allover Unicorns - Blue Multi (Backing)	2724-17

### Cutting Instructions

*Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.*

#### From the Unicorn Blocks - Royal (A), cut:

- Fussy cut (8) 9 1/2" squares, each centered on a block.

#### From the Rainbow Stripe - Rainbow Multi (B), cut:

- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Starry Night Texture - Royal (C), cut:

- (8) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2" x 9 1/2" strips.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Lime (D), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Lemon (E), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Pink (F), cut:

- (4) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 1/2" squares.
- (1) 2 1/2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Light Blue (G), cut:

- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 2" squares.

#### From the Unicorn Silhouette - Pink Multi (H), cut:

- (2) 8 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 8 1/2" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Royal (I), cut:

- (2) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Rainbow Toss - Blue Multi (J), cut:

- (8) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" strips.

#### From the Rainbow Hearts - Pink Multi (K), cut:

- (6) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 1/2" squares.

#### From the Unicorn Silhouette - Royal Multi (L), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x 51 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 1/2" x 61 1/2" WOF strips, piece as needed.

#### From the Allover Unicorns - Blue Multi (Backing), cut:

- (2) 69" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 69" x 69" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.*

1. Sew together (1) 2" Fabric D square, (1) 2" x 9 1/2" Fabric C strip and (1) 2" Fabric E square, in that order from left to right, to make the top row (Fig. 1).

2. Sew (1) 2" x 9 1/2" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 9 1/2" Fabric A square to make the middle row (Fig. 1).

3. Sew together (1) 2" Fabric F square, (1) 2" x 9 1/2" Fabric C strip and (1) 2" Fabric G square, in that order from left to right, to make the bottom row (Fig. 1).

4. Sew the (3) rows from Steps 1-3 together lengthwise to make (1) 12 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 1).

5. Repeat Steps 1-4 to make (8) Block One squares total.

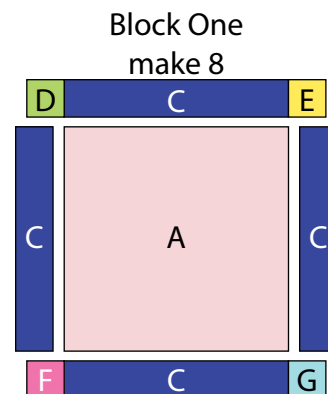

6. Place (1) 2 1/2" Fabric I square on the top left corner of (1) 8 1/2" Fabric H square, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 3).

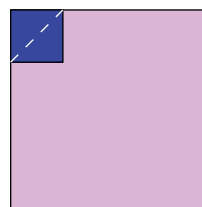

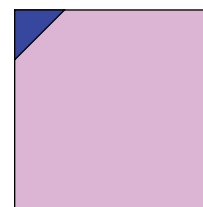

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7. Follow Figure 4 for the seam direction to add a 2 ½" Fabric I square to each of the remaining corners of the 8 ½" Fabric H square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 5).

8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (8) Unit 1 squares total.

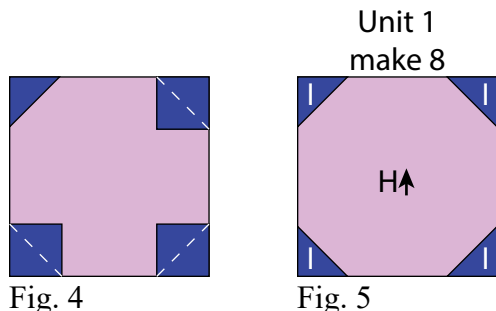

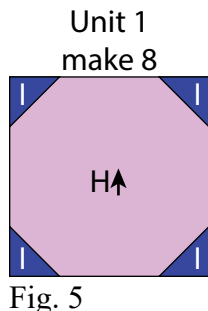

9. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric F square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric J strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 7).

10. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric K square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric J strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 9).

11. Repeat Steps 9-10 to make (32) Unit 2 strips total.

12. Repeat Steps 9-10 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (32) Unit 3 strips.

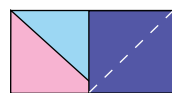

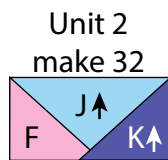

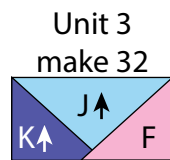

13. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to the left end of (1) Unit 3 strip along the Fabric K sides to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (32) Unit 4 strips total.

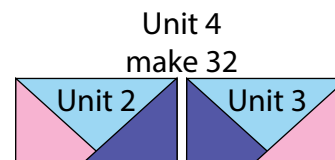

14. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric K square to each end of (1) Unit 4 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 12 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (8) Block Two squares total.

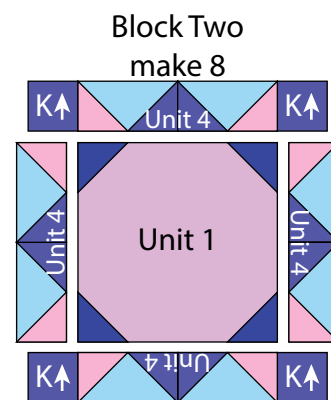

15. Sew together (1) Block One square, (2) Block Two squares and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 13). Repeat to make Row Four.

16. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (2) Block One squares and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make Row Two (Fig. 13). Repeat to make Row Three.

17. Sew together the (4) Rows from Steps 15-16, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 48 ½" x 48 ½" Center Block (Fig. 13).

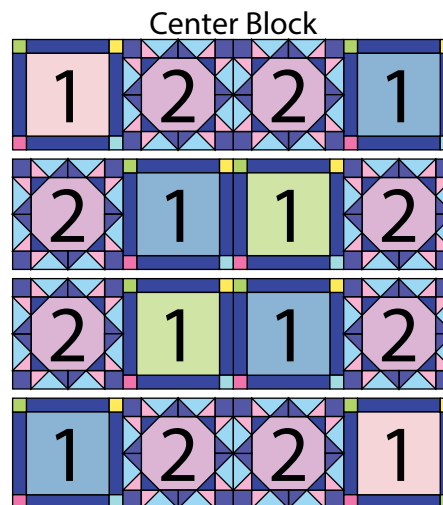

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### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

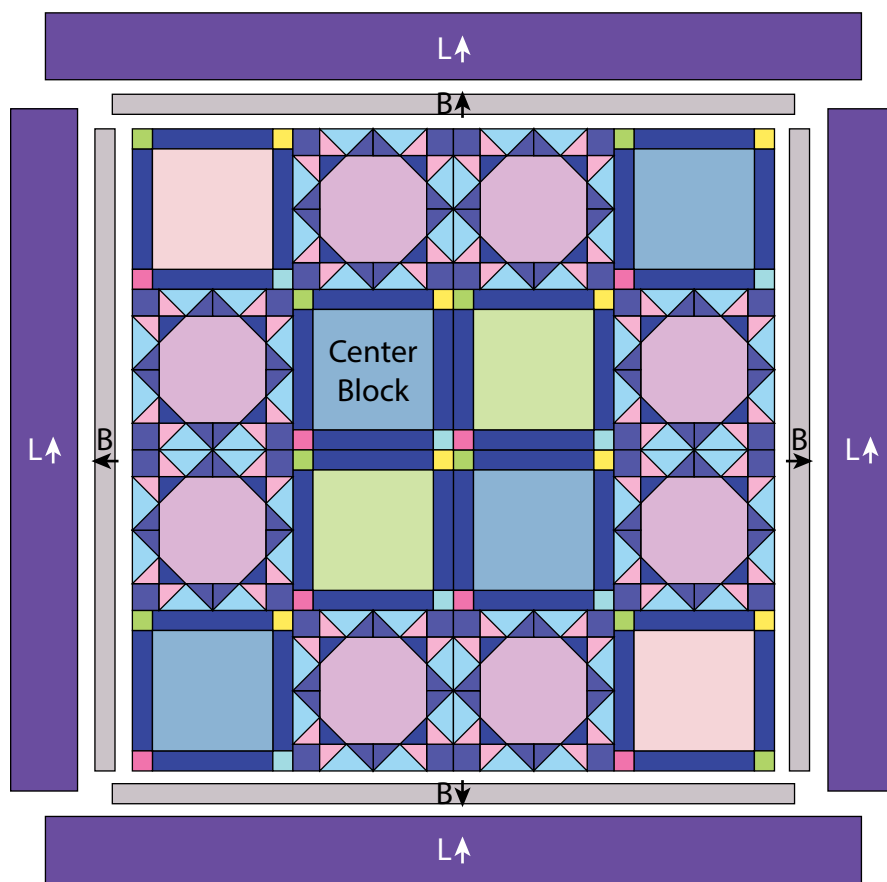
18. Sew (1) 2" x 48 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 51 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

19. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 51 1/2" Fabric L strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 1/2" x 61 1/2" Fabric L strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

20. Layer and quilt as desired.

21. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

22. Bind as desired.
