3/4 yard	Folio Basics - Forest (E)	7755-68
⅓ yard	Snowflakes - Cream (F)	2831-33
1 yard	Folio Basics - Early Green (G)	7755-62
5/8 yard	Birds and Branches - Black (H)	2830-99
½ yard	Holly & Mistletoe - Cream (I)	2829-33
1 1/8 yards	Snowflakes - Red (J)	2831-88*
2 <sup>1</sup> / <sub>3</sub> yards	Border Stripe - Black (K)	2832-99

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Blocks - Red (A):

• Fussy cut (20) 6 ½" squares, each centered on a block.

#### From the Folio Basics - Black (B), cut:

- (7) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (10) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.

#### From the Folio Basics - Red (C), cut:

- (8) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1" x 7 ½" strips.
- (10) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 1" x 8 ½" strips.

#### From the 3 x 3 inch Stamps - Black (D):

• Fussy cut (30) 3 ½" squares, each centered on a stamp.

#### From the Folio Basics - Forest (E), cut:

- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 1 ½" x 3 ½" strips.
- (9) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (60) 1 ½" x 5 ½" strips.

#### From the Snowflakes - Cream (F), cut:

• (11) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (98) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### From the Folio Basics - Early Green (G), cut:

• (13) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (196) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Birds and Branches - Black (H), cut:

• (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 4 ½" squares.

#### From the Holly & Mistletoe - Cream (I), cut:

• (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (21) 4 ½" squares.

#### From the Snowflakes - Red (J), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 64 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 ½" strips.
- (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Border Stripe - Black (K), fussy cut:

- (2) 5 ½" x 81" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips, each centered on a row of flowers.
- (2) 5 ½" x 69 ½" LOF strips, each centered on a row of


#### From the Large Flower Allover - Black (Backing), cut:

• (2) 85" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 73" x 85" back.

#### **Block Assembly**

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 6 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure**  $7\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $7\frac{1}{2}$ ". Repeat to make (20) Unit 1 squares total.



2. Sew (1) 1" x 7 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) 8 1/2" Block One square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (20) Block One squares total.




3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 3 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of (1) 3 ½" Fabric D square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric E strip

to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric D square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 3). Trim the block to measure 4 ½" x 4 ½". Repeat to make (30) Block Two squares total.




4. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric G square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 5).






- 5. Place another 2 1/2" Fabric G square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 7).
- 6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (98) Unit 2 strips total.

Repeat to make (28) Block Three rectangles total.





7. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric H strip lengthwise to make (1) Block Three rectangle (Fig. 8).





8. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric I square lengthwise to make (1) Block Four rectangle (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (21) Block Four rectangles total.



- 9. Sew together (5) Block Two squares and (4) Block Three rectangles, end to end and alternating them from left to right, to make Row One.
- 10. Refer to Figure 10 for component identification, placement and orientation to make Row Two through Row Eleven.
- 11. Sew together the (11) Rows from Steps 9-10, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 52 1/2" x 64 1/2" Center Block.




**Quilt Top Assembly** 

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
12. Sew (1) 2" x 64 ½" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 55 ½" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 13. Center (1) 5 ½" x 81" Fabric K strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ½" from the top edge of the block and stop a ½" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1) 5 ½" x 69" Fabric K strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).
- 15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



- 16. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 17. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric J strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 18. Bind as desired.
