



⅜ yard	Tossed Snowman - Light Gray (C)	F417-90
1 ⅛ yards	Geometric Triangles - Red (D)	F424-88
⅞ yard	Trees - Red (E)	F421-88
¾ yard	Snowflake - Gray/White (F)	F418-9
⅔ yard	Vines - Gray (G)	F426-90
¾ yard	Bias Plaid - Red/White (H)	F425-89
1 ¼ yards	Stacked Trees - Gray (I)	F420-9
¼ yard	Polar Bear Allover - Red (J)	F422-88
1 yard	Vines - Red (K)	F426-88*
5 yards	Snowflake - Red/White (Backing)	F418-8

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Leaping Reindeer - Gray/Red (A), cut:

- (1) 14 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 14 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles.

From the Tossed Snowman - Dark Gray (B), cut:

- (2) 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 8 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Snowman - Light Gray (C), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x 14 ½" WOF strip.

From the Geometric Triangles - Red (D), cut:

- (10) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 3 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

From the Trees - Red (E), cut:

- (8) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

From the Snowflake - Gray/White (F), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (68) 3 ½" squares.

From the Vines - Gray (G), cut:

- (6) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (72) 3 ½" squares.

From the Bias Plaid - Red/White (H), cut:

- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3 ½" x 14 ½" strips.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 3 ½" x 20 ½" strips.

From the Stacked Trees - Gray (I), cut:

- (1) 20 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 20 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (3) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 6 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

From the Polar Bear Allover - Red (J), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

From the Vines - Red (K), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 3 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Snowflake - Red/White (Backing), cut:

- (2) 86" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 86" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

- Place (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric F square on top of (1) 3 ⅞" Fabric K square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew ¼" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 3 ½" square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.







- Place (1) 3 ½" Fabric F square on the left side of (1) 3 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric K strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 5).



3. Place another 3 1/2" Fabric F square on the right side of the 3 1/2" x 6 1/2" Fabric K strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 2 strip (Fig. 7).

4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (8) Unit 2 strips total.




5. Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric F square on the top left corner of (1) 6 1/2" Fabric J square, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 9).




6. Follow Figure 10 for the seam direction to add a 3 1/2" Fabric F square to each of the remaining corners of the 6 1/2" Fabric J square to make (1) Unit 3 square (Fig. 11).

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (4) Unit 3 squares total.




8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 12 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation while using (24) 3 1/2" Fabric G squares and (6) 6 1/2" x 14 1/2" Fabric I strips to make (6) Unit 4 strips.



9. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 13 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation while using (24) 3 1/2" Fabric G squares and (6) 6 1/2" x 20 1/2" Fabric I strips to make (6) Unit 5 strips.

10. Place (1) 3 1/2" Fabric G square on the left side of (1) 3 1/2" x 14 1/2" Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 14). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 14). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 15).



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11. Place another 3 1/2" Fabric G square on the right side of the 3 1/2" x 14 1/2" Fabric H strip, right sides together (Fig. 16). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 16). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 6 strip (Fig. 17).



13. Repeat Steps 10-11 and refer to Figures 18-19 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (10) Unit 7 strips and (8) Unit 8 strips.

14. Repeat Steps 10-11 and refer to Figure 20 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation while using (12) 3 1/2" Fabric G squares and (6) 3 1/2" x 20 1/2" Fabric H strips to make (6) Unit 9 strips.



15. Sew (1) 3 1/2" x 14 1/2" Fabric D strip to each side of (1) 8 1/2" x 14 1/2" Fabric A strip. Sew (1) unit 7 strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A strip to make (1) 14 1/2" x 20 1/2" Block One rectangle (Fig. 21). Repeat to make (4) Block One rectangles total.



16. Repeat Step 15 and refer to Figures 22-23 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (4) Block Two rectangles and (1) Block Three rectangle.





Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

17. Sew together (3) Unit 6 strips and (2) Unit 2 strips, end to end and alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) Unit 1 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Seven.

18. Sew together (1) Unit 9 strip, (1) Block One rectangle, (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Block One rectangle and (1) Unit 9 strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Six.

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19. Sew together (3) Block Four strips and (2) Block Three squares, alternating them from left to right. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each end of the newly sewn strip to make Row Three. Repeat to make Row Five.


20. Sew together (1) Unit 9 strip, (1) Block Two rectangle, (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Block Three rectangle, (1) Unit 5 strip, (1) Block Two rectangle and (1) Unit 9 strip, lengthwise and in that order from left to right, to make Row Four.

21. Sew together the (7) Rows from Steps 17-20, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the quilt top.

22. Layer and quilt as desired.

23. Sew the (7) 2 1/2" x WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

24. Bind as desired.
