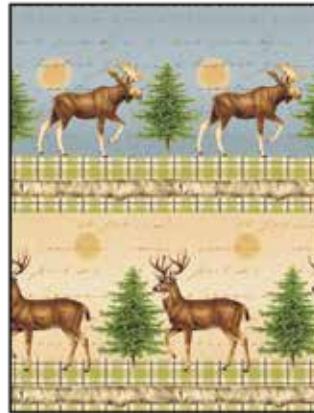

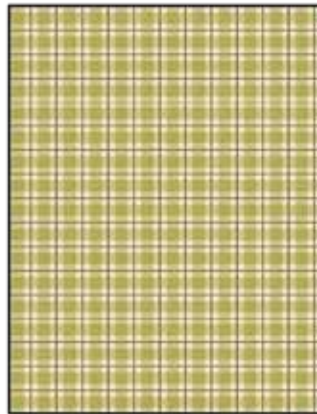

### Materials

1 ¼ yards	Folio Basics - Sepia Brown (B)	7755-39
1 ⅝ yards	Plaid - Green (C)	9170-66*
½ yard	Critter Foot Print - Tan (D)	9171-33
½ yard	Bark Tree Texture - Taupe (E)	9169-30
⅓ yard	Wildlife Moonlight - Blue (F)	9168-11
⅞ yard	Deer Tonal Print - Cream (G)	9172-9
2 yards	Border Stripe - Blue (H)	9167-11
4 yards	Chickadee on Branches - Cream (Backing)	9166-44

\*Includes binding

### Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Deer Banner Panel - Cream (A), fussy cut:

- (1) 18 ½" x 18 ½" square, centered on the large deer square.
- (4) 8 ½" x 8 ½" squares, each centered on a small panel square.

#### From the Folio Basics - Sepia Brown (B), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (3) 3 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3 ½" squares.
- (1) 2" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2" x 18 ½" strips.
- (2) 2" x 21 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 8 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 11 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 51 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 53 ½" strips.

#### From the Plaid - Green (C), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 20 ½" strips.
- (2) 2 ½" x 24 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 51 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Critter Foot Print - Tan (D), cut:

- (1) 3 ⅞" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 3 ⅞" squares.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

#### From the Bark Tree Texture - Taupe (E), cut:

- (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 6 ½" x 3 ½" strips.

#### From the Wildlife Moonlight - Blue (F), cut:

- (1) 6 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" squares.

#### From the Deer Tonal Print - Cream (G), cut:

- (1) 12 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 12 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (2) 6 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 6 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

#### From the Border Stripe - Blue (H), cut:

- (4) 6" x 68" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.

#### From the Chickadee on Branches - Cream (Backing), cut:

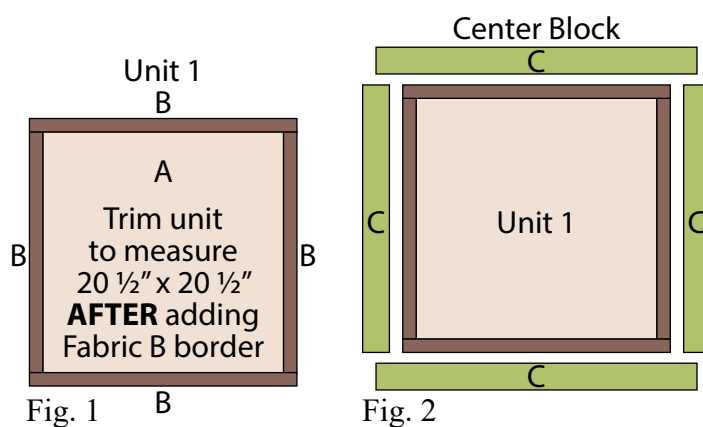
- (2) 72" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 72" x 72" back.

### Block Assembly

*Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.*

1. Sew (1) 2" x 18 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 18 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 21 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 1). **Trim the unit to measure 20 ½" x 20 ½"**.

2. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 24 ½" Fabric C square to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make the Center Block (Fig. 2).



3. Sew (1) 2" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 11 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 3). **Trim unit to measure 10 ½" x 10 ½"**. Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 squares total.

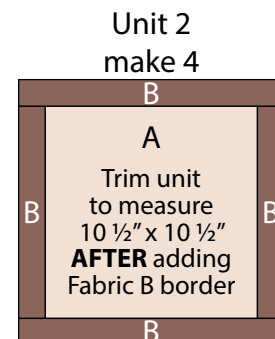

4. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $10\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D strip to each side of the Unit 2 square. Sew (1)  $1\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric D square to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

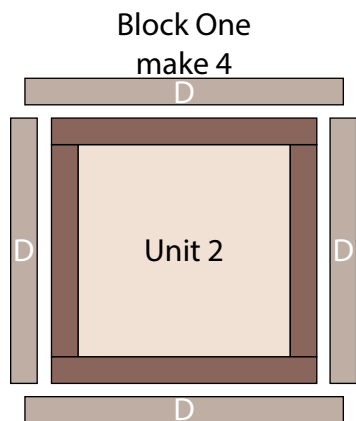
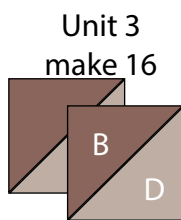
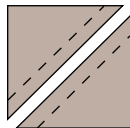
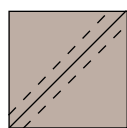
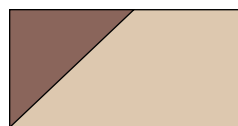
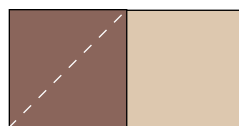

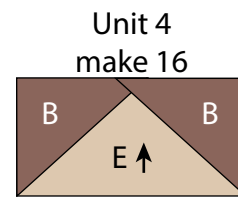
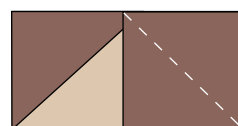
5. Place (1)  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric D square on top of one  $3\frac{7}{8}$ " fabric B square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 5). Sew  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 5). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 6) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 3 squares (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (16) Unit 3 squares total.



6. Place (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the left side of (1)  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 9). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance.



7. Place another  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric B square on the right side of the  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a  $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance to make (1) Unit 4 strip (Fig. 11).



8. Repeat Steps 6-7 to make (16) Unit 4 strips total.

9. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of (1) Unit 4 rectangle to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric F square to make the middle row. Sew the rows together to make (1) Block Two square. Repeat to make (4) Block Two squares total.

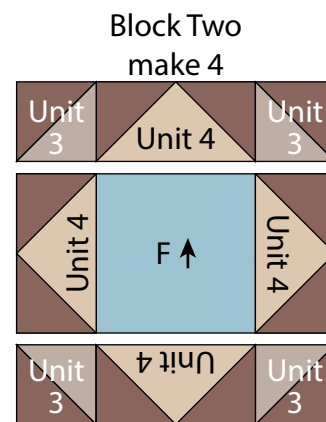

### Quilt Top Assembly

*(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)*

10. Sew (1)  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip to the top and bottom of (1) Block One square to make (1) Side Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border.

11. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

12. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip, (1) Block One square, (1)  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $12\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric G strip and (1) Block Two square, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

13. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

14. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $48\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1)  $2$ " x  $51\frac{1}{2}$ " Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 51 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 53 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

16. Center (1) 6" x 68" Fabric H strip on (1) side of the quilt top and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ¼" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

17. Repeat Step 16 to sew (1) 6" x 68" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 13).

18. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 13), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ¼" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.

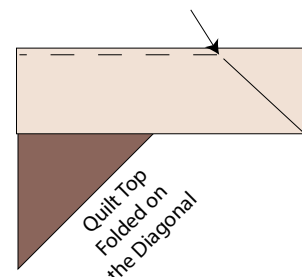
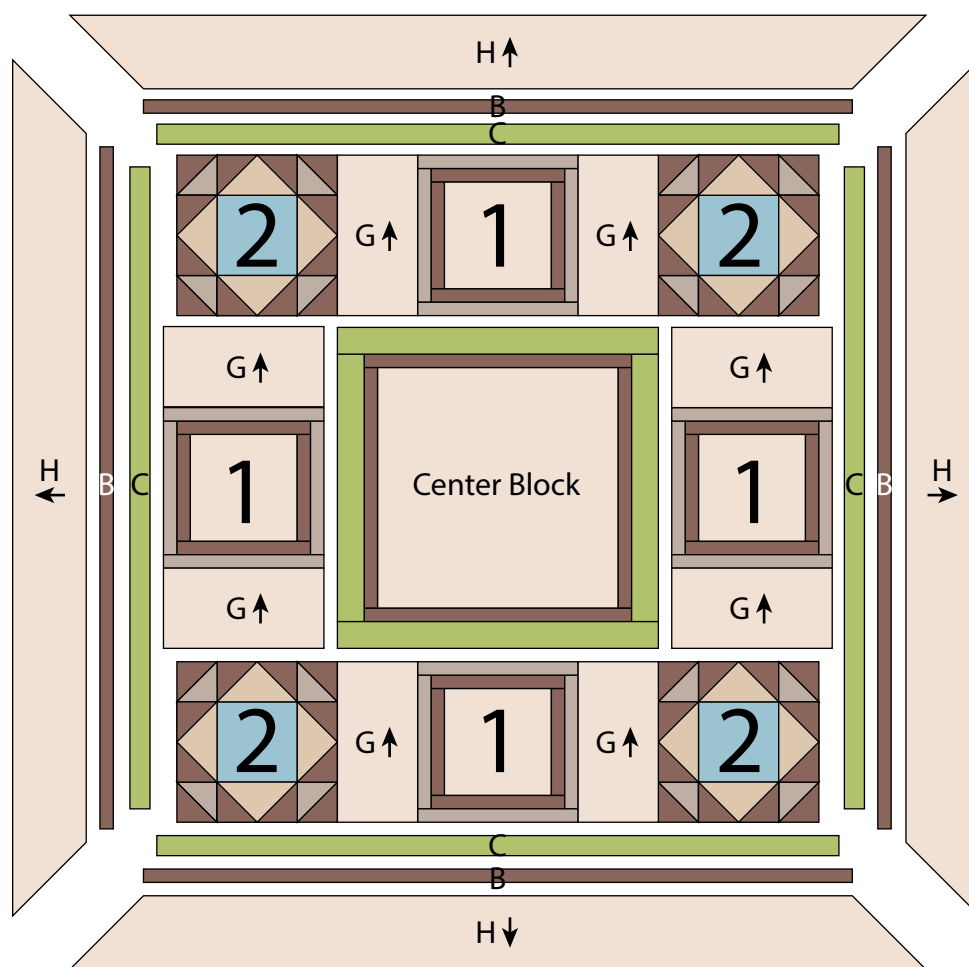

19. Layer and quilt as desired.

20. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric C strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.

21. Bind as desired.
