



Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Aliens Tossed Allover - Gray (A), cut:

• (1) 4 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 4 ½" squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Crimson Red (B), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 64 ½" strips
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Alien World - Navy (C), cut:

- (6) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 4 ½" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Silver Gray (D), cut:

- (6) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 4 ½" squares.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Marigold (E), cut:

• (4) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/8" squares.

From the Milky Way Galaxy - Black (F), cut:

- (12) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 4 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (4) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 1/8" squares.

From the Planet Allover - Navy (G), cut:

• (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 2 ½" squares.

From the Rocket Allover - Black (H), cut:

• (2) 8 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (6) 8 ½" squares.

From the Astronaut Allover - Navy (I), cut:

- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 66 ½" strips.
- (3) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 5 ½" x 60 ½" strips.

From the Continuous Blocks - Gray (Backing), cut:

• (2) 84" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 68" x 84" back.

Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric B square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 2).






2. Place another 2 ½" Fabric B square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric C strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).

3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (24) Unit 1 strips total.






4. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric A square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 8 ½" Unit 2 square (Fig. 5). Repeat to make (6) Unit 2 squares total.



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5. Place (1) 4 ½" Fabric C square on the left side of (1) 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 7).








6. Place another 4 ½" Fabric C square on the right side of the 4 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 9).

7. Repeat Steps 5-6 to make (24) Unit 3 strips total.






8. Repeat Steps 5-6 and refer to Figure 10 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (24) Unit 4 strips.



9. Place (1) 2 1/8" Fabric E square on top of (1) 2 1/8" Fabric F square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 11). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 11). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 12) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 1/2" square to make (2) Unit 5 squares (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (96) Unit 5 squares total.







10. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric G square to the left side of (1) Unit 5 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 5 square to the left side of (1) 2 ½" Fabric D square to make the bottom row. Sew together the (2) rows lengthwise to make (1) 4 ½" Unit 6 square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (48) Unit 6 squares total.



11. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to each end of (1) Unit 3 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 16 ½" Block One square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.



12. Sew (1) Unit 6 square to each end of (1) Unit 4 square to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 4 strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" Fabric H square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 16 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (6) Block Two squares total.




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13. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make Row One (Fig. 17). Repeat to make Row Three.


- 14. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) Block One square to make Row Two (Fig. 17). Repeat to make Row Four.
- 15. Sew together the (4) Rows, lengthwise and in numerical order from top to bottom, to make the 48 ½" x 64 ½" Center Block (Fig. 17).



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
16. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 64 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 17. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 66 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 18. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 19. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 20. Bind as desired.
