#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Embroidery Thread Allover - Aqua (A), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Spools of Thread - Yellow (B), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Pin Cushion Allover - Pink (C), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Teal (D), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Needle and Thread - Blue (E), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Embroidery Thread Allover - Pink (F), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Lemon (G), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Knitting Allover - Blue (H), cut:

- (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 2 ½" x 6 ½" strips.
- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Needle and Thread - White (I), cut:

- (18) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (288) 2 ½" squares.
- (12) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 14 ½" strips.
- (8) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 12 ½" strips.

#### From the Tape Measure Allover - Green (J), cut:

• (16) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (31) 2 ½" x 14 ½" strips.

#### From the Buttons - Pink (K), cut:

• (2) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (20) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Folio - Light Pink (L), cut:


• (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Block Panel - Cream (Backing), cut:

• (2) 74" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 58" x 74" back.


#### **Block Assembly**


- 1. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric I square on the top portion of (1) 2 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric A strip, right sides together (Fig. 1). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 1). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 2).
- 2. Place another 2 ½" Fabric I square on the bottom portion of the 2 ½" x 6 ½" Fabric A strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 4).
- 3. Repeat Steps 1-2 to make (12) Unit 1 strips total.






4. Repeat Steps 1-2 and refer to Figures 5-11 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (12) strips of each unit for Units 2 through Unit 8.







- 5. Sew (1) 2 ½" Fabric I square to the top and to the bottom of (1) 2 ½" Fabric A square to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 12). Repeat to make (6) Unit 9 strips total.
- 6. Repeat Step 5 and refer to Figures 13-19 for fabric identification and placement to make (6) strips of each unit for Unit 10 through Unit 16.






- 7. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) Unit 9 strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 17 square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (6) Unit 17 squares total. Pay attention to the orientation of the units.
- 8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 21-27 to make (6) of each unit for Unit 18 through Unit 24.

- 9. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew (1) Unit 17 square to the left side of (1) Unit 18 square to make the top row (Fig. 28). Repeat to make (6) top rows total.
- 10. Paying attention to the orientation of the units, sew (1) Unit 19 square to the left side of (1) Unit 20 square to make the bottom row (Fig. 28). Repeat to make (6) bottom rows total.
- 11. Sew the (2) rows from Steps 9-10 together to make (1) Unit 25 square (Fig. 28). Repeat to make (6) Unit 25 squares total.



12. Repeat Steps 9-11 and refer to Figure 29 for component identification, placement and orientation to make (6) Unit 26 squares.



13. Sew (1)
1 ½" x 12 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of (1) Unit 25 square.
Sew (1) 1 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 25 square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 30). Repeat to make (6) Block One squares total.




**Quilt Top assembly** 


(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
15. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip, (1) Block One square and (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip together in that order to make Row One. Repeat to make Row Three.

Sew (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip, (1) Block One square, (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip, (1) Block Two square and (1) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strip together in that order to make Row Two. Repeat to make Row Four.

- 17. Sew (4) 2 ½" Fabric K squares and (3) 2 ½" x 14 ½" Fabric J strips together end to end and alternating them to make (1) Sashing Row. Repeat to make (5) Sashing Rows total.
- 18. Sew the (5) Sashing Rows and (4) block rows together, alternating them, to make the quilt top.
- 19. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 20. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric L strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 21. Bind as desired.
