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Fabrics in the Collection



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Tote Materials

1/3 yard	Novelty Scatter - Navy	2228-77
1/4 yard	Novelty Scatter - Green	2228-66
1/4 yard	Scissors - Blue	2229-17
1/3 yard	Hexies - Red	2227-88
1/3 yard	Daisy Stitches - Red	2230-88
½ yard	Daisy Stitches - Butternut	2230-34

You will also need:

• ½ yard of Fusible Fleece

Tote Cutting Instructions

Please note: all strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Novelty Scatter - Navy (A), cut:

- (1) 2 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 ½" x 16 ½" strips.
- (1) 3 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3 ½" x 16 ½" strips.

From the Novelty Scatter - Green (B), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" squares.

From the Scissors - Blue (C), cut:

• (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 3" squares.

From the Hexies - Red (D), cut:

• (1) 9 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 9 ½" x 16 ½" strips

From the Daisy Stitches - Red (E), cut:

• (2) 4" x WOF strips

From the Daisy Stitches - Butternut (F), cut:

• (1) 14 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 14 ½" x 16 ½" strips.

From the Fusible Fleece, cut:

- (2) 14 ½" x 16 ½" strips
- (2) 1" x WOF strips

Sewing Instructions

1. To make the prairie points, take (1) 3" Fabric C square and fold it in half across one diagonal, wrong sides together (Fig. 1). Press. Fold the Fabric C in half again and press to make (1) Unit 1 prairie point (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (6) Unit 1 points.







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
2. Repeat Step 1 with (4) 3" Fabric B squares while referring to Figure 3 to make (4) Unit 2 points.



3. Measure and mark the center of (1) 3 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric A strip, on the right side of the fabric. Position and pin in place (3) Fabric C points and (2) Fabric B points as shown, aligning the raw edges of the point with the top edge of the strip. The units should overlap slightly, making sure they stop 1 ¾" from the side edges of the strip. Using an ½" seam allowance stitch the units to the strip to make (1) Unit 3 (Fig. 4). Repeat to make a second Unit 3 strip.




4. Sew (1) Unit 3 to the bottom of (1) 9 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric D strip. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric A strip to the top of the Fabric D strip to make the Bag Front (Fig. 5). Repeat to make the Bag back.




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- 5. Press one 14 ½" x 16 ½" fusible fleece onto the back side of the bag front and quilt as desired. Repeat to with the bag back.
- 6. Place the bag front and bag back right sides together. Stitch down the two short sides and across the bottom to make the outer bag.
- 7. Measure in from the side edge 1 ½" and up from the bottom edge, 1 ½" at each bottom corner. Cut out the square of fabric (Fig. 6). Open the cut bottom and align the bottom edge with the side edge and sew the two edges together (Fig. 3). Repeat with the other bottom corner to make the box bottom on the outer bag.



- 8. Place the two 14 ½" x 16 ½" Fabric F pieces right sides together. Stitch down the two short sides and across the bottom, leaving a 4" opening for turning to create the lining.
- 9. Repeat Step 7 to create a box corner on each bottom corner of the lining.
- 10. Fold (1) 4" x WOF Fabric E strip in half lengthwise and press (Fig. 8). Open the folded fabric and fold each long edge to the creased centerline and press (Fig. 9).
- 11. Fold the pressed fabric in half again and press to make one 1" x WOF strip (Fig. 10). Slide one 1" strip of fusible fleece into the handle and press. Top stitch down both long sides ½" in from the edge (Fig. 11).
- 12. Repeat Steps 10-11 to make a second strap.



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13. Trim each strap to the desired length. Pin one strap to the front of the bag, aligning the raw edge of the strap with the top of the bag front. Repeat to add the second strap to the back of the bag.


