



#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Counting Book - Royal (A):

• Fussy cut (12) 7" squares each centered on an animal block.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Royal (B), cut:

- (4) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2" x 7" strips.
- (6) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 2" x 10" strips.
- (6) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 58 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.
- (5) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 1 ½" x 43 ½" strips.
- (1) 1 1/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/4" x 5" strips.
- (2) 1 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 1 1/4" x 6 1/2" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Tossed Bee - Red (C), cut:

- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 8 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 1 ½" x 10 ½" strips.

#### From the Modern Melody Basics - Pigment White (D), cut:

- (12) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (160) 3" squares.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 55 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 43 ½" strips.

#### From the Zebra - Red (E), cut:

• (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (10) 5 ½" squares.

#### From the Tossed Allover Rhino - Aqua (F), cut:

• (2) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (12) 5 ½" squares.

#### From the Tossed Allover Animal - Yellow (G), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" squares.

#### From the 1-10 Numbers - Royal (H), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 5 ½" squares.

#### From the Tossed Chameleon - Royal (I), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (6) 5 ½" squares.

#### From the Giraffe - Butter (J), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" squares.

#### From the Tossed Allover Monkey - Yellow (K), cut:

• (1) 5 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 5 ½" squares.

#### From the Border Stripe - Aqua (L), cut:

- (2) 5" x 58 ½" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 5" x 43 ½" LOF strips.

#### From the Tossed Allover Hippo - White (M), cut:

• (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 5" squares.


#### From the 1-10 Numbers - White (Backing), cut:

• (2) 78" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 63" x 78" back.

#### **Block Assembly**


Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

1. Sew (1) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 5" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 5" Fabric M square. Sew (1) 1 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 6 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric M square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 1). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.




2. Sew (1) 2" x 7" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 7" Fabric A block. Sew (1) 2" x 10" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A block. **Trim the block to measure 8** ½"

**square** to make (1) Unit 1 square (Fig. 2). Repeat to make (12) Unit 1 squares total.

3. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 8 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) Unit 1 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 10 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 1 square to make (1) Block Two square (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (12) Block Two squares total.




4. Place (1) 3" Fabric D square on the top left corner of (1) 5 ½" Fabric E square, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 5). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¼" away from the sewn seam.









5. Follow Figure 6 for the seam direction to add a 3" Fabric D square to each of the remaining corners of the 5 ½" Fabric E square to make (1) Unit 2 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (10) Unit 2 squares total.








6. Repeat Steps 4-5 and refer to Figures 9-13 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (12) Unit 3 squares, (2) Unit 4 squares, (6) Unit 5 squares, (6) Unit 6 squares, (2) Unit 7 squares and (2) Unit 8 squares.
















7. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to the top of (1) Unit 3 square to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 14). Repeat to make a second Unit 9 strip.

8. Repeat Step 7 and refer to Figures 15-17 for component identification and placement to make (2) Unit 10 strips, (2) Unit 11 strips and (2) Unit 12 strips.







9. Sew together (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 9 strip, (1) Block Two square, (1) Unit 10 strip and (1) Unit 2 square, in that order from left to right, to make Row One (Fig. 18).


- 10. Repeat Step 9 and refer to Figure 18 for component identification and placement to make Row Three, Row Five and Row Seven.
- 11. Sew (8) assorted unit squares together to make Row Two (Fig. 18). Repeat to make Row Four and Row Six.
- 12. Sew the (7) Rows together, in numerical order, to make the Center Block (Fig. 18).

13. Sew (1) 1 ¼" x 58 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 5" x 58 ½" Fabric L strip lengthwise to make (1) Unit 13 strip (Fig. 19). Repeat to make a second Unit 13 strip.






#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 15. Sew (1) 2" x 55 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 43 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.


- 16. Sew (1) Unit 13 strip to each side of the Center Block.
- 17. Sew (1) Block One square to each end of (1) Unit 14 strip. Repeat to make a second strip. Sew the strips to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 18. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 19. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 20. Bind as desired.
