#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

#### From the Jacobean Panel - Red (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 22 ½" x 42 ½" rectangle, centered on the panel.

#### From the Folio - Forest (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.
- (2) 2" x 25 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 60 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 42 ½" strips.

#### From the Jacobean Vine - Gold (C), cut:

- (1) 2 \%" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 \%" squares.
- (5) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (68) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Folio - Off White (D), cut:

- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 48 ½" strips.
- (2) 4 ½" x 36 ½" WOF strips.
- (1) 2 1/8" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 2 1/8" squares.
- (9) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

#### From the Mini Bud Monotone - Green (E), cut:

- (12) Template 1 vine segments.
- (12) Template 2 vine segments.
- (2) Template 7 vine segments.
- (2) Template 8 vine segments.

#### From the Damask - Green (F), cut:

- (12) Template 3 vine segments.
- (12) Template 4 vine segments.
- (2) Template 5 vine segments.
- (2) Template 6 vine segments.

#### From the Damask - Red (G), cut:

• (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (96) 2 ½" squares.

#### From the Border Stripe - Cream (H), cut:

- (2) 7 ½" x 80" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 7 ½" x 60" LOF strips.

#### From the Mini Bud Monotone - Red (I), cut:

• (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

#### From the Jacobean Vine - Cream (Backing), cut:

• (2) 64" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 64" x 84" back.

#### **Block Assembly**

### Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- 1. Sew (1) 2" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 22 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric A panel. Sew (1) 2" x 25 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A panel to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure 24** ½" x 44 ½".
- 2. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric C square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance (Fig. 3).




- 3. Place another 2 ½" Fabric C square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).
- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (34) Unit 1 strips total.

5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, location and seam direction to make (46) Unit 2 strips.

6. Place (1) 2 %" Fabric C square on top of (1) 2 %" Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 7). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 7). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 8) to make (2) halfsquare triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 ½" square to make (2) Unit 3 squares (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 squares total.








- 7. Sew together (11) Unit 1 strips, end to end, to make (1) Inner Side Border (Fig. 10). Repeat to make a second Inner Side Border.
- 8. Sew together (6) Unit 1 strips end to end. Sew (1) Unit 3 square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Inner Top Border (Fig. 11). Repeat to make the Inner Bottom Border.

9. Sew (1) Inner Side Border to each side of the Center Block. Sew the Inner Top Border and Inner Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make (1) Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 12).



10. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 48 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Unit 4 rectangle. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 36 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 4 rectangle to make the Unit 5 rectangle (Fig. 13).





- 11. Following the manufacturer's instructions, trace the listed number of each template onto the paper side of the fusible web. Roughly cut out each template about 1/8" outside the drawn lines.
- 12. Press each template onto the wrong side of the fabrics as listed on the templates. Cut out each template on the drawn lines.
- 13. Refer to Figure 14 to arrange and press the (12) Fabric E Template 1 scrolls, (12) Fabric E Template 2 scrolls, (2) Fabric E Template 7 scrolls, (2) Fabric E Template 8 scrolls onto the Fabric D border of the Unit 5 rectangle.
- 14. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Unit 6 rectangle.

15. Repeat Steps 13-14 and refer to Figure 15 for location and orientation to add the (12) Fabric F Template 3 scrolls, (12) Fabric F Template 4 scrolls, (2) Fabric F Template 5 scrolls, (2) Fabric F Template 6 scrolls to the Unit 6 rectangle. Finish the raw edges of each shape with a decorative stitch such as a buttonhole or satin stitch to make the Unit 7 rectangle.



16. Sew together (14) Unit 2 strips, end to end, to make the Outer Side Border (Fig. 16). Repeat to make a second Outer Side Border.

17. Sew together (9) Unit 2 strips end to end. Sew (1) 2 ½' Fabric G square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Outer Top Border (Fig. 17). Repeat to make the Outer Bottom Border.

#### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 18. Sew (1) Outer Side Border to each side of the Unit 7 rectangle. Sew the Outer Top Border and Outer Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 7 rectangle.

- 19. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 60 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Unit 7 rectangle. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 7 rectangle.
- 20. Center (1) 7 ½" x 80" Fabric H strip on (1) side of the Unit 7 rectangle and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a 1/4" from the top edge of the block and stop a 1/4" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.
- 21. Repeat Step 20 to sew (1) 7 ½" x 60" Fabric H strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 7 rectangle, making sure to stop and start 1/4" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Unit 7 rectangle on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 18).
- 22. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 18), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a 1/4" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.







- 23. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 24. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric I strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 25. Bind as desired.




Quilt Layout
