1 yard	Border Stripe - Blue (D)	9995-11
3/8 yard	Folio Basics - Pale Gray (E)	7755-91
5/8 yard	Tonal Floral - Blue (F)	9990-11
1 2/3 yards	Seed Pack - Sage (G)	9994-66
4 1/4 yards	Kittens in Circles - Blue (Backing)	9993-11

*Includes binding

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Banner Panel 24 in - Blue (A), fussy cut:

- (1) 20 1/2" x 30 1/2" rectangle, centered on the large block.
- (4) 5 1/4" x 7 3/4" rectangles, each centered on a small block.

From the Folio Basics - Charcoal (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 30 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 23 1/2" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 7 3/4" strips.
- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 8 1/4" strips.
- (7) 2 1/2" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Folio Basics - Silver (C), cut:

- (2) 1 1/2" x 32 1/2" WOF strips.
- (4) 1 1/2" x 24 1/2" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 56 1/2" strips.
- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 46 1/2" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Blue (D), cut:

- (2) 7 1/2" x 32 1/2" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.
- (2) 7 1/2" x 24 1/2" LOF strips.

From the Folio Basics - Pale Gray (E), cut:

- (3) 1 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 1/2" x 50 1/2" strips.
- (2) 1 1/2" x 40 1/2" WOF strips.

From the Tonal Floral - Blue (F), cut:

- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 52 1/2" strips.
- (3) 2 1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 1/2" x 44 1/2" strips.

From the Seed Pack - Sage (G), cut:

- (2) 5 1/2" x 58 1/2" LOF strips.
- From the remaining fabric, cut (2) 5 1/2" x 56 1/2" strips, piece as needed.

From the Kittens in Circles - Blue (Backing), cut:

- (2) 76" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 64" x 76" back.

Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Sew (1) 2" x 30 1/2" Fabric B strip to each side of the 20 1/2" x 30 1/2" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 23 1/2" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1).

Trim the block to measure 22 1/2" x 32 1/2".

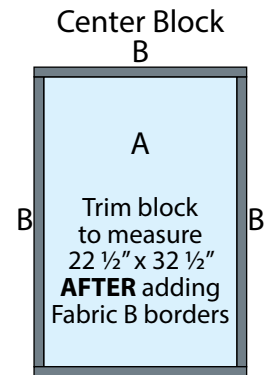

2. Sew (1) 2" x 7 3/4" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 5 1/4" x 7 3/4" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2" x 8 1/4" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Block One rectangle (Fig. 2). Trim the block to measure 7 1/2" x 9 1/2". Repeat to make (4) Block One rectangles total.

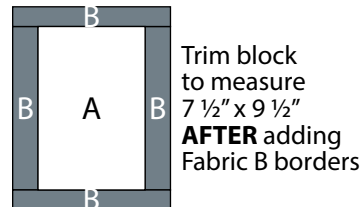

3. Sew (1) 1 1/2" x 24 1/2" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 7 1/2" x 24 1/2" Fabric D strip lengthwise. Sew (1) Block One rectangle to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 3). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.

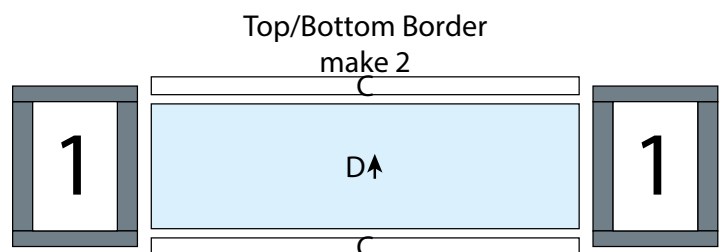


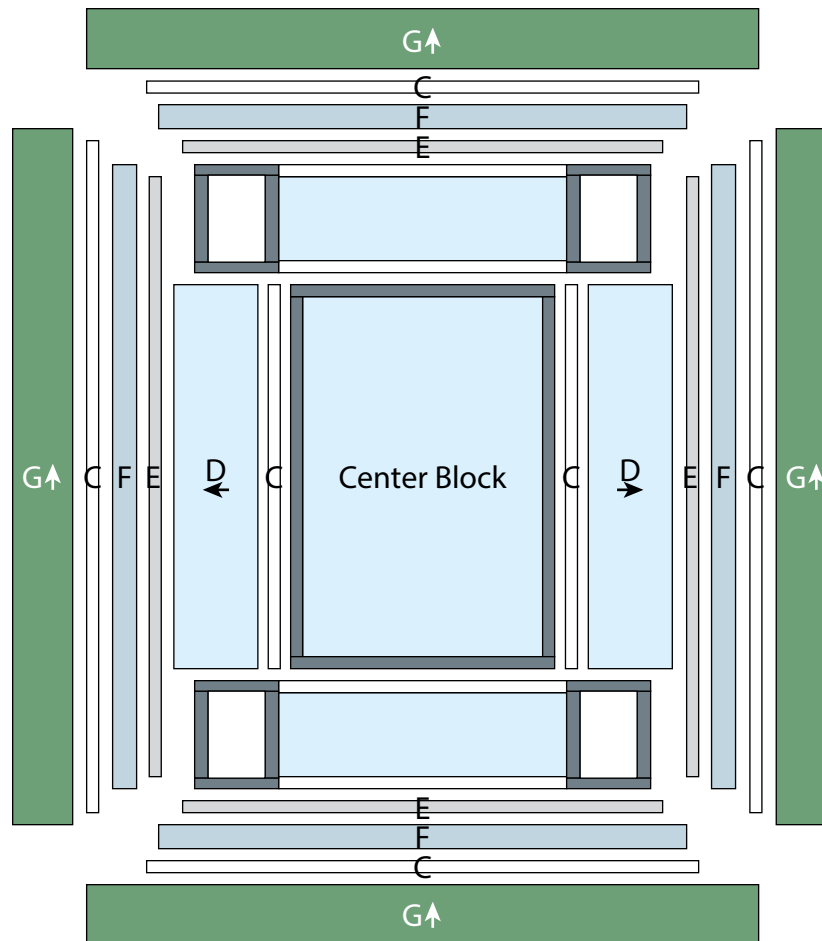

Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)

4. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block.
5. Sew (1) 7 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block.
6. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Borders to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
7. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 40 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
8. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 52 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 44 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
9. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 46 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
10. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 58 ½" Fabric G strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 56 ½" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
11. Layer and quilt as desired.
12. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
13. Bind as desired.
