





Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Delicate Vine - Light Gray (A), cut:

- (2) 20 ½" WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 20 ½" squares.
- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.

From the Cabbage Rose - Black/Gray (B), cut:

- (1) 20 %" WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 20 %" squares.
- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.

From the Watercolor Paisley - Gray/White (C), cut:

- (1) 20 1/8" WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 20 1/8" squares.
- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.
- (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 5 ½" x 20 ½" strips.

From the Watercolor Paisley - Black/Gray (D), cut:

- (2) 20 ½" WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 20 ½" squares.
- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.

From the Delicate Vine - Yellow (E), cut:

• (8) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 5 ½" x 20 ½" strips.

From the Cabbage Rose - Black/Yellow (F), cut:

• (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.

From the Leaves - Black/Yellow (G), cut:

• (4) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 5 ½" x 20 ½" strips.

From the Cabbage Rose - Gray/Yellow (H), cut:

- (1) 10 %" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 10 %" squares.
- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.

From the Geometric Dots - Multi (I), cut:

- (2) 10 %" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 10 %" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (8) 10 %" triangles.
- (1) 10 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 10 ½" squares.

From the Daisy - Black/Yellow (J), cut:

• (1) 10 %" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 10 %" squares.

From the Folio Basics - Pale Gray (K), cut:

• (1) 20 %" WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 20 %" squares. Cut the squares across (1) diagonal to make (4) 20 %" triangles.

From the Folio Basics - Black (L), cut:

• (8) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.


From the Delicate Vine - Light Gray (Backing), cut:

• (3) 88" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 88" x 88" back.


Block Assembly

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.

1. Place (1) 10 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric J square on top of (1) 10 $\frac{7}{8}$ " Fabric H square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 1). Sew $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 1). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 2) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 10 $\frac{1}{2}$ " square to make (2) Unit 1 squares (Fig. 3). Repeat to make (4) Unit 1 squares total.





2. Sew (1) 10 %" Fabric I triangle to adjacent sides of (1) Unit 1 square to make (1) Unit 2 triangle (Fig. 4). Repeat to make (4) Unit 2 triangles total.




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3. Place (1) 10 ½" Fabric I square on the 90 degree corner of (1) 20 1/8" Fabric K triangle, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the small square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 3 triangle (Fig. 6). Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 triangles total.







4. Sew together (1) Unit 2 triangle and (1) Unit 3 triangle along their long sides to make (1) 20 ½" Unit 4 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 squares total.




- 5. Sew together (2) 5 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric E strips and (2) 5 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric C strips, lengthwise and alternating them from left to right, to make (1) 20 ½" Unit 5 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (4) Unit 5 squares total.
- 6. Place (1) 20 ½" Fabric D square on the lower left corner of (1) Unit 5 square, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¹/₄" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 6 square (Fig. 9). Repeat to make (4) Unit 6 squares total.





7. Place (1) 10 ½" Fabric C square on the bottom left corner of (1) Unit 6 square, right sides together (Fig. 10). Sew across the diagonal of the smaller square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 10). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle ¹/₄" away from the sewn seam (Fig. 11).






- 8. Follow Figure 12 for the seam direction to add a 10 ½" Fabric F square to the upper right corner of the Unit 6 square to make (1) Unit 7 square (Fig. 13).
- 9. Repeat Steps 7-8 to make (4) Unit 7 squares total.






10. Sew together (2) 5 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric G strips and (2) 5 ½" x 20 ½" Fabric E strips, lengthwise and alternating them from top to bottom, to make (1) 20 ½" Unit 8 square (Fig. 14). Repeat to make (4) Unit 8 squares total.



- 11. Place (1) 20 ½" Fabric A square on the upper right corner of (1) Unit 8 square, right sides together. Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner. Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle 1/4" away from the sewn seam to make (1) Unit 9 square (Fig. 15). Repeat to make (4) Unit 9 squares total.
- 12. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figure 16 for fabric identification, placement, seam direction and orientation to make (4) Unit 10 squares.







- 13. Repeat Step 1 and refer to Figure 17 for fabric identification and placement while using (2) 20 1/8" Fabric B squares and (2) 20 1/8" Fabric C squares to make (4) 20 1/2" Unit 11 squares.
- 14. Repeat Steps 7-8 and refer to Figure 18 for component identification, placement, seam direction and orientation while using (4) Unit 11 squares, (4) 10 ½" Fabric A squares and (4) 10 ½" Fabric D squares to make (4) Unit 12 squares.






15. Sew (1) Unit 4 square to the left side of (1) Unit 7 square to make the top row. Sew (1) Unit 10 square to the left side of (1) Unit 12 square to make the bottom row. Sew the (2) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 40 ½" x 40 ½" Block One square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares



Quilt Top Assembly

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 16. Sew together the (4) Block One squares in to a 2 x 2 matrix to make the quilt top.

- 17. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 18. Sew the (8) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric L strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 19. Bind as desired.



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
