Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Panel 24in x 44in - Multi (A), fussy cut:

- (1) 21 ½" square, centered on the large block.
- (4) 9 ½" squares, each centered an a small block.

From the Twinkle Basics - Golden Yellow (B), cut:

- (2) 2" x 21 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 2" x 24 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 48 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2" x 45 ½" strips.

From the Gingham - Pink (C), cut:

- (2) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 9 ½" strips.
- (3) 2" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 2" x 12 ½" strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (4) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.

From the Tossed Frog - Multi (D), cut:

• (1) 5" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 5" squares.

From the Tossed White Flower - Pink (E), cut:

• (5) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (64) 2 ³/₄" squares.

From the Tossed Roses and Bees - White (F), cut:

- (4) 2 ³/₄" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 ³/₄" x 5" strips.
- (3) 2 3/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 2 3/4" squares.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 9 ½" strips.
- (6) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 ½" x 11 ½" strips.

From the Border Stripe - Multi (G), cut:

• (4) 5 ½" x 62" Length of Fabric (LOF) strips.

From the Twinkle Basics - Pink (H), cut:

• (6) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.


From the Tossed Carriages - Multi (Backing), cut:

• (2) 66" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 66" x 66" back.


Block Assembly

Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a ¼" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise noted.


1. Sew (1) 2" x 21 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 21 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 24 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). **Trim the block to measure** 23 ½" x 23 ½".



2. Sew (1) 2" x 9 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of (1) 9 ½" Fabric A square. Sew (1) 2" x 12 ½" Fabric C strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A square to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 2). **Trim the block to measure**11 ½" x 11 ½". Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.




3. Place (1) 2 ³/₄" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 2 ³/₄" x 5" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 3). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 3). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance (Fig. 4).








- 4. Place another 2 ³/₄" Fabric E square on the right side of the 2 ³/₄" x 5" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 5). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 5). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¹/₄" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 6).
- 5. Repeat Steps 3-4 to make (32) Unit 1 strips total.






6. Sew (1) 2 ¾" Fabric F square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 5" Fabric D square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together lengthwise to make (1) 9 ½" Unit 2 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (8) Unit 2 squares total.



7. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 9 ½" Fabric F strip to each side of (1) Unit 2 square. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric F strip to the top and to the bottom of the Unit 2 square to make (1) 11 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (8) Block Two squares total.




8. Sew (1) Block Two square to the top and to the bottom of (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric C strip to make (1) Side Border (Fig. 9). Repeat to make a second Side Border.



9. Sew (1) Block Two square to each side of (1) 1 ½" x 11 ½" Fabric C strip. Sew (1) Block One square to each end of the newly sewn strip to make the Top Border (Fig. 10). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.




Quilt Top Assembly


(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.)
10. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.

- 11. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 12. Sew (1) 2" x 45 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 48 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 13. Center (1) 5 ½" x 62" Fabric G strip on (1) side of the Center Block and pin in place. Start sewing the strip a ½" from the top edge of the block and stop a ¼" from the bottom edge. **DO NOT TRIM THE EXCESS.** Repeat with the opposite side.

- 14. Repeat Step 13 to sew (1) 6 ½" x 62" Fabric G strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block, making sure to stop and start ¼" away from each end of the block. To miter each corner, fold the Center Block on a diagonal, wrong side together. This should line up the strips from adjacent sides (Fig. 11).
- 15. Starting at the sewn seam (represented by the arrow in Figure 11), draw a 45-degree line to the edge of the fabric. Sew on the drawn line. Trim the excess fabric leaving a ½" seam. Repeat this step with the remaining corners to make the quilt top.



- 16. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 17. Sew the (6) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric H strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 18. Bind as desired.
