

#### **Cutting Instructions**

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

## From the Flag Panel 24in x 44in - Multi (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 43" x 23" rectangle, centered on the flag.

## From the Fireworks - White (B), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 3" squares.
- (2) 2 ½" x 23" WOF strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 47" strips.
- (1) 1 3/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 1 3/4" squares.
- (3) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 59 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" strips.
- (3) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 52" strips.

#### From the Set Stars - Multi (C), cut:

- (1) 3" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (4) 3" squares.
- (2) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares.

### From the Modern Melody Basics - Crimson Red (D), cut:

- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (32) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (16) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares.
- (2) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 3" strips.

#### From the Tossed Words - Blue (E), cut:

- (6) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (80) 3" squares.
- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

### From the Folio Basics - White on White (F), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (24) 3" squares.
- (7) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (48) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

### From the Modern Melody Basics - Navy (G), cut:

- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (16) 3" squares.
- (1) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" squares.
- (1) 1 3/4" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (8) 1 3/4" x 3" strips.

#### From the Tossed Liberty Bell - Red (H), cut:

- (3) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (40) 3" squares.
- (2) 3" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 3" x 5 ½" strips.

### From the Vertical Stripe - Red (I), cut:

- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 55 ½" strips.
- (3) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 2 ½" x 49 ½" strips.

### From the Tossed Eagles - Multi (J), cut:

• (6) 5 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (4) 5 ½" x 62" strips.

#### From the Fireworks - Blue, cut:

• (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.


## **Tossed Stars - Blue (Backing), cut:**

• (2) 80" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 70" x 80" back.

#### **Block Assembly**

Note: Pay attention to the unit orientations when assembling the various components. Use a 1/4" seam allowance with right sides together (RST) unless otherwise

1. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 23" Fabric B strip to each side of the 43" x 23" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 47" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 1). Trim the block to measure 45 ½" x 25 ½".



2. Place (1) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Fabric C square on the left side of (1) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 3" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 2). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 2). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 3).






- 3. Place another 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Fabric C square on the right side of the 1 3/4" x 3" Fabric D strip, right sides together (Fig. 4). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 4). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 1 strip (Fig. 5).
- 4. Repeat Steps 2-3 to make (16) Unit 1 strips total.
- 5. Repeat Steps 2-3 and refer to Figure 6 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (8) Unit 2 strips.









- 6. Sew (1) 1 3/4" Fabric D square to each end of (1) Unit 1 strip to the make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 1 strip to each side of (1) 3" Fabric C square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 5 ½" Unit 3 square (Fig. 7). Repeat to make (4) Unit 3 squares total.
- Unit 3 make 4 Minu D Fig. 7
- 7. Sew (1) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" Fabric G square to each end of (1) Unit 2 strip to the make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 2 strip to each side of (1) 3" Fabric B square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 5 1/2" Unit 4 square (Fig. 8). Repeat to make (2) Unit 4 squares total.




8. Place (1) 3" Fabric D square on the left side of (1) 3" x 5 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 9). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 9). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance (Fig. 10).









- 9. Place another 3" Fabric D square on the right side of the 3" x 5 ½" Fabric E strip, right sides together (Fig. 11). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 11). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 5 strip (Fig. 12).
- 10. Repeat Steps 8-9 to make (16) Unit 5 strips total.







11. Repeat Steps 8-9 and refer to Figures 13-15 for fabric identification, placement and seam direction to make (8) Unit 6 strips, (32) Unit 7 strips and (16) Unit 8 strips.








12. Sew (2) Unit 7 strips together end to end to make (1) Unit 9 strip (Fig. 16). Repeat to make (16) Unit 9 strips total.



13. Sew (2) Unit 8 strips together end to end to make (1) Unit 10 strip (Fig. 17). Repeat to make (8) Unit 10 strips total.



14. Sew (1) 3" Fabric E square to each end of (1) Unit 5 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 5 strip to each side of (1) Unit 3 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 10 ½" Unit 11 square (Fig. 18). Repeat to make (4) Unit 11 squares total.



15. Sew (1) 3" Fabric H square to each end of (1) Unit 6 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 6 strip to each side of (1) Unit 4 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 10 ½" Unit 12 square (Fig. 19). Repeat to make a second Unit 12 square.







16. Sew (1) 3" Fabric F square to each end of (1) Unit 9 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 9 strip to each side of (1) Unit 11 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 15 ½" Block One square (Fig. 20). Repeat to make (4) Block One squares total.

17. Sew (1) 3" Fabric F square to each end of (1) Unit 10 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 10 strip to each side of (1) Unit 12 square to make the middle row. Sew together the (3) rows lengthwise to make (1) 15 ½" Block Two square (Fig. 21). Repeat to make a second Block Two square.



18. Sew (1) Block One square to each side of (1) Block Two square to make the Top Border (Fig. 22). Repeat to make the Bottom Border.



### **Quilt Top Assembly**

(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 19. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block lengthwise.

- 20. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 55 ½" Fabric I strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2 ½" x 49 ½" Fabric I strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 21. Sew (1) 1 <sup>3</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" x 59 <sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 3/4" x 52" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 22. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 62" Fabric J strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 5 ½" x 62" Fabric J strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.

- 23. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 24. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric K strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 25. Bind as desired.
