1 ½ yards	Modern Melody Basics - Black (B)	1063-99*
3/8 yard	Mini Heart Blocks - Cream (C)	9337-44
½ yard	Bandana - Red (D)	9333-88
1 ½ yards	Plaid - Cyan (E)	9334-17
⅓ yard	Paw and Bone Tonal - Cream (F)	9339-44
½ yard	Puppies Start Quilt - Cyan (G)	9338-17
²⁄₃ yard	Tossed Allover Puppies - Cream (H)	9336-44
4 ½ yards	Pups in the Garden Scenic - Cyan (Backing)

Cutting Instructions

Please note: All strips are cut across the width of fabric (WOF) from selvage to selvage edge unless otherwise noted.

From the Pups in the Garden Banner Panel - Red (A):

• Fussy cut (1) 21 ½" x 41 ½" rectangle, centered on pups.

From the Modern Melody Basics - Black (B), cut:

- (2) 1 ½" x 41 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 23 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 32 ½" WOF strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 45 ½" strips.
- (4) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 63 ½" strips.
- (3) 1 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 1 ½" x 50 ½" strips.
- (7) 1" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 1" x 8 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips for the binding.

From the Mini Heart Blocks - Cream (C), cut:

• (2) 3 ½" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Bandana - Red (D), cut:

- (2) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 2 1/8" squares.
- (2) 2" x 30 ½" WOF strips.
- (2) 1 ½" x 42 ½" WOF strips, piece as needed.

From the Plaid - Cyan (E), cut:

- (4) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 65 ½" strips.
- (3) 4 ½" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end to end with diagonal seams and cut (2) 4 ½" x 58 ½" strips.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (112) 2 ½" squares.

From the Paw and Bone Tonal - Cream (F), cut:

- (2) 2 1/8" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (28) 2 1/8" squares.
- (7) 2 ½" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (56) 2 ½" x 4 ½" strips.

From the Puppies Start Quilt - Cyan (G):

• Fussy cut (14) 4 ½" squares, each centered on a puppy block.

From the Tossed Allover Puppies - Cream (H), cut:

- (1) 8 ½" x WOF strip. Sub-cut (2) 8 ½" x 5 ½" strips and (4) 8 ½" x 4 ½" strips.
- (2) 5 1/4" x WOF strips. Sub-cut (8) 5 1/4" x 8 1/2" strips.

From the Pups in the Garden Scenic - Cyan (Backing), cut:


• (2) 81" x WOF strips for the backing. Sew the strips together and trim to make the 66" x 81" back.

Block Assembly



Note: The arrows in figures represent the fabric print direction. Pay attention to the fabric and unit orientations when assembling the various components.

- 1. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the 21 ½" x 41 ½" Fabric A rectangle. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 23 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Fabric A rectangle to make (1) Unit 1 rectangle (Fig. 1). Trim the unit to measure 22 ½" x 42 ½".
- 2. Sew (1) 3 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric C strip to each side of the Unit 1 rectangle to make the Center Block (Fig. 2).




3. Place (1) 2 \%" Fabric F square on top of (1) 2 \%" Fabric D square, right sides together. Draw a line across the diagonal of the top square (Fig. 3). Sew 1/4" away from each side of the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 3). Cut the (2) squares apart on the drawn diagonal line (Fig. 4) to make (2) half-square triangles. Trim the half-square triangles to measure 2 ½" square (Fig. 5) to make (2) Unit 2 squares. Repeat to make (56) Unit 2 squares total.



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
4. Place (1) 2 ½" Fabric E square on the left side of (1) 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 6). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper right corner to the lower left corner (Fig. 6). Flip open the triangle formed and press (Fig. 7). Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance.



- 5. Place another 2 ½" Fabric E square on the right side of the 2 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric F strip, right sides together (Fig. 8). Sew across the diagonal of the square from the upper left corner to the lower right corner (Fig. 8). Flip open the triangle formed and press. Trim away the excess fabric from behind the triangle, leaving a ¼" seam allowance to make (1) Unit 3 strip (Fig. 9).
- 6. Repeat Steps 4-5 to make (56) Unit 3 strips total.





7. Sew (1) Unit 2 square to each side of (1) Unit 3 strip to make the top row. Repeat to make the bottom row. Sew (1) Unit 3 strip to each side of (1) 4 ½" Fabric G square to make the middle row. Sew the (3) rows together to make (1) Block One square (Fig. 10). Repeat to make (14) Block One squares total.





- 8. Sew (1) 1" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" x 4 ½" Fabric H strip to make (1) Unit 4 rectangle (Fig. 11). Repeat to make (4) Unit 4 rectangles total.
- 9. Sew (1) 1" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of (1) 8 ½" x 5 ½" Fabric H strip to make (1) Unit 5 rectangle (Fig. 12). Repeat to make a second Unit 5 rectangle.



10. Sew (1) 1" x 8 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of (1) 5 ¼" x 8 ½" Fabric H strip to make (1) Unit 6 rectangle (Fig. 13). Repeat to make (8) Unit 6 rectangles total.



Quilt Top Assembly


(Follow the Quilt Layout while assembling the quilt top.) 11. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 42 ½" Fabric D strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 2" x 30 ½" Fabric D strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

- 12. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 45 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 32 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 13. Sew together (4) Unit 6 rectangles and (3) Block One squares, alternating them from top to bottom, to make (1) Side Border. Repeat to make a second Side Border. Sew (1) Side Border to each side of the Center Block.
- 14. Sew together (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 4 rectangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 5 rectangle, (1) Block One square, (1) Unit 4 rectangle and (1) Block One square, in that order from left to right, to make the Top Border. Repeat to make the Bottom Border. Sew the Top Border and Bottom Border to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.

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- 15. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 63 ½" Fabric B strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 1 ½" x 50 ½" Fabric B strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block.
- 16. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 65 ½" Fabric E strip to each side of the Center Block. Sew (1) 4 ½" x 58 ½" Fabric E strip to the top and to the bottom of the Center Block to make the quilt top.
- 17. Layer and quilt as desired.
- 18. Sew the (7) 2 ½" x WOF Fabric B strips together, end to end with 45-degree seams, to make the binding. Fold this long strip in half lengthwise with wrong sides together and press.
- 19. Bind as desired.
